FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



SOLEMNITY OF SAINTS PETER & PAUL: This liturgical year, we celebrate many solemnities and feasts that we miss in their importance during weekdays, but have the pleasure of enjoying on a Sunday. Today we enjoy the two great saints who led our church from the beginning and give witness to our special evangelization role, sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ. We remember their stories, the great odds and difficulties in teaching about Christ and the rich traditions that became our church. They give us inspiration for living our faith today.

ANNIVERSARY OF OUR PASTORATE: We begin our 6th year together this week! It is true: time flies when you are having fun. I've been so blessed to be your pastor and to have so many wonderful councils, committees and a Pastoral Staff to work with and enjoy over the last five years. Our collaboration and ministry is fun and a joy, building up the Body of Christ here at Saint Paschal Baylon. I ask for your continued trust, prayers, support and energy to work together for this next year, the last of my "first" term. We are at a wonderful point of reflection, having just celebrated our 60th anniversary as a parish, beginning to celebrate our 60th anniversary of the school, and embarking on a 5-year strategic plan (more in next week's bulletin). Let us continue to ask the Holy Spirit for guidance and leadership as we fulfill our Eucharistic mission.

PASTORAL COUNCIL REPORT: What's been happening at our Pastoral Council meetings? And what does the Pastoral Council normally do? These are questions I receive from time to time. Our last meeting of the year the other day helped us recap what "we do" as Pastoral Council:

- We are setting goals for the parish regularly at our Leadership Days.
- We continue to fulfill last year's leadership day, with the big goal being our Strategic Plan.
- We hoped for evangelization efforts, and these have been successful as we have had a "block party" (and hope for more neighborhood gatherings, looking for hosts at this time), visiting new homes in the area, and are looking forward to Highland Heights Home Days (more on this below).
- We evaluate parish life and even deal with little details like requesting new lighting in the horseshoe parking lot. (It may be helpful to remember that the Blessed Sacrament Community is our landlord and that the parish rents the space on the lower floor of the west wing of the rectory, as well as the horseshoe parking lot).
- We hear reports of the finances and building reports (our baptismal font has taken a little longer to finish – it was a bigger project than the mason realized and has not been completed nor dedicated).

- We pray together as Pastoral Council and see in what ways we can make our parish life more vibrant and engaging for every parishioner.

We thank the dedicated men and women (and our two youth representatives!) who advise and council Deacon Joe, Fr. John and myself in leading our parish.

HIGHLAND HEIGHTS HOME DAY: This year we will have an info booth at Highland Heights Home Day – Saturday, July 26. I am grateful for the Welcome Committee, Clown & Helping Hands Ministry, Deacon Joe and our school faculty for taking care of our booth, displaying our van, and sharing the “good news” about SPB to our neighbors and friends.
