“What exactly do you do on Parish Council?” I am often asked.

The question deserves an answer.

As a support to the Pastor and the Pastoral Staff, we raise issues and concerns to develop strategies for improving the parish life:

We vision, we plan, we implement.

Cannon Law states: (Can. 511). In each diocese, to the extent that pastoral circumstances recommend it, a pastoral council is to be established whose responsibility it is to investigate under the authority of the bishop all those things which pertain to pastoral works, to ponder them and to propose practical conclusions about them.

Most issues come before Council although they may be generated from other groups. Oftentimes, issues need little discussion and the issue is approved. In this way, no one single group works alone for all the ministries are part of the Church.

Now the Specifics -

*There is a dedicated group working on our very important Strategic Planning. This document will determine the direction St. Paschal Baylon parish will go to ensure the quality of our spiritual lives and remain a vibrant parish - alive and well in the area.

* We are kept informed of our financial status through the Finance Council and advise as needed.

* School issues are brought before Council.

* We communicate through the annual Leadership Day and most recently “The Quarterly” for ministry leaders to meet, to be informed and to participate in the advisory process. We do not walk alone.

So, all ministries are linked to Pastoral Council which in turn informs Pastoral Staff.

In an effort to be open and clear as to what takes place in Council, we will be summarizing our meetings and post them in the bulletin - PASTORAL COUNCIL CORNER.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



22nd Sunday in ordinary time: In this most famous spot in scripture, Jesus lets his disciples know the plan for his life – his passion and dying. In our own culture, it sure is hard to think of our death, our suffering, let alone anyone else's or Christ's reminding of our taking up a cross to follow and be a "true disciple." We want the glory without the pain, the life without the challenges. That would be easy! Yet, we hear once again the importance of forfeiting our life for the sake of others. With Christians suffering and dying for the faith still, in other parts of the world, but especially in the Middle East and Africa, how can we complain? They know the cross; they experience the glory. May we realize how important discipleship and sacrifice are as we renew our efforts through this Eucharist to live the glory of our cross, the glory of our baptism.

Preparing for advent: In the liturgical and church organizational world we are in high gear to prepare for Advent & Christmas time. It takes a great deal of effort and organization. We order our plants (and we thank you for your generosity and care to make our art & environment so beautiful) and other preparations are being done. I am reminded of this because I would encourage you at this time to look for Advent Wreath candles – for later in this year it is quite the challenge, having the experience myself of getting them too late. Our PSR students will be making an Advent Wreath in November and to prepare for it, believe it or not, we have to get them now. Look ahead to the special meal and prayer time you wish to celebrate with your family during the "high holy season" of the year and buy or order your liturgical candles now. Traditionally they have been violet, rose or blue and white. There is no "fixed" color, but in order to have these colors in November, you must purchase them now. Furthermore, Christmas wreaths with candles are always available "in season," as you know, and this is a great way of continuing the festivities around the family dining room table.

Our 61st anniversary: This Tuesday is our anniversary of our parish establishment. Monday, at our Labor Day Mass we will celebrate in a special way, recognizing the great labors that bring our parish much joy. During our 61st year, we are also celebrating the 60th anniversary of the school. It is amazing to think, with construction schedules these days, how quickly the early parishioners were able to plan, construct and open a school.
