Recipe for Life

There's a lot of biblical talk about cooking ingredients specifically salt and leaven. For those not familiar with kitchen talk, "leaven" would be the yeast which causes dough to rise. Without leaven you have some very flat bread. But there's more to this leaven. What is the leaven in our lives? What moves us to rise to the occasions to live our faith?

Then there's salt.

Our salt is mined and pretty much keeps it's saltiness . The salt that Jesus speaks of in Matthew 5:13, "You are the salt of the earth, but if the salt loses its taste with what can it be seasoned?" The salt here is gathered along the shore lines of Judea and, yes, it can become weak. Now back to cooking. So, you want to use good salt and not a salt that will lose its taste. More importantly, if we lose the taste for loving, for justice, for mercy, for hope, and for faith what shall we use to season our lives?

The question remains. How shall we leaven and salt our lives? The answer is in the kitchen where we need to prepare those eucharistic meals for others.

(Order of Sr. Ursula - Ursulines) will be our guest and speak of her personal commitment of 'working in the vineyards' and of those commitments of Ursuline Sr. Dorothy Kazel; lay minister, Jean Donovan and Maryknoll Sisters Maura Clarke and Ita Ford who were murdered in El Salvador December 2, 1980. We must learn from those who have given their lives in the vineyard. They rose to the occasion; they were seasoned by their faith.
