Tithing from October 25/26, 2014: \$19,547.00

As Father Lane mentioned in his homily on October 18/19, we paid off our loan on the church's heating and air conditioning system – one year earlier than expected! This is due to your generous contributions, and to your continued support of the Rooted in Faith Diocesan Capital Campaign. Beginning with this month, we will continue paying the **\$355,709.39 loan** for the roofs of the original school building (now the early childhood center/wing), the gym and Father O'Brien Hall (cafeteria). Thank you for supporting our loan repayment.

Eat Your Vegetables

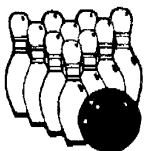
God said: See, I give you every seed-bearing plant on all the earth and every tree that has seed-bearing fruit on it to be your food; Genesis 1:29
