FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



CHRIST THE KING: We celebrate the last Sunday of the liturgical year by remembering who rules our hearts and minds – Jesus Christ, King of the Universe! Ending one year, beginning another year gives us an opportunity to reflect on so much, make resolutions and affirm our faith journey. Not only that, our king identifies with us and all those in need, as we hear once again the Gospel of Matthew. As members of the Body of Christ, do we also hear how we are called to deepen our solidarity to the “least of our brothers and sisters?” We are blessed to have a parish that takes seriously our call to these social teachings in Matthew 25. Let us collectively and personally reflect on how we may continue to improve.

REPORT OF THE QUARTERLY: Many of our parish leaders were able to attend our “Quarterly” meeting to communicate our parish information and share in the life of the parish. Groups that were not present shared reports, such as the “Our Lady of the Rosary, Star of the Sea Rosary Making Group.” They wished to share that in the last 18 years they have made and distributed (across the globe) 80,535 rosaries. The Welcoming Committee scheduled their next event for new parishioners on Sunday, April 19; with the 10:00 a.m. Mass and brunch to follow. Deacon Joe distributed a new information guidebook for the Helping Hands ministries, listing all the services the parish provides in Northeast Ohio. It is quite extensive what we do together to help our brothers and sisters in need. (This booklet will be posted on our parish website.)

Patty Knezevic, our Business Manager presented an update on the Grateful Giving Offertory Enhancement Program. After the “dramatic” letter and beginning to the program, parishioners are responding, registering, signing up for electronic giving and seriously contributing financially to enhance our parish’s ministry.

Kathy Pohlhammer, our Co-Director of Development, reported our fundraising efforts since our September 14 Leadership Day. Highlights included the efforts that are being done to replace Bingo, such as another Tuition Raffle (start preparing to buy a raffle ticket after January 1) and Taste of the Town (with an auction of so many wonderful items from our parish organizations and ministries and coupon booklet featuring restaurant deals). Many restaurants around town have committed to be part of Taste of the Town and tickets will go on sale in December for this **Saturday, January 31, 6:30 p.m.** event. All funds will benefit the school, especially the arts program, enhancing our STREAM Education (Science Technology, Religion, English, Arts & Mathematics). Furthermore, Kathy reported our Finance Council goal to move toward one big event by November 2016 – and that in the year 2016, our two event fundraisers will be the Spring Fling in May 2016 and “gala” (or some other name to be determined) in November 2016.

I mentioned during the meeting that in both fiscal years, last and this, we had an emergency situation where fundraisers for parish organizations have been tithing to the parish 10% to support our finances. We are grateful to the PTO for tithing 20% to the parish last year. Beginning with the 2015-2016 fiscal year, parish organizations that raise funds are going to model what Pope Francis has requested, the church to care more for

our the poor. So in our parish, we will tithe 10% to the poor – with 5% going to Manna Ministry and 5% going to our Helping Hands Ministry. By doing this, all our fundraisers will have outreach to the most in need. I am asking that when advertising these fundraisers, you also mention “10% of the funds raised to help the poor and those in need in Northeast Ohio.”

The rest of the Quarterly meeting was devoted to the 5-year Strategic Plan, with Kelly Keefe, one of the members of this ad hoc committee making a presentation. Leaders are grateful to the Strategic Planning Committee for their hard work since January. The committee is finalizing a preamble and tweaking other action items. We look forward to implementation!

It was a great meeting – and we look forward to our next Quarterly – February 3.

SSS NEWS: We are grateful for your prayers while we were at chapter November 9 – 15. Most of us felt it was our best chapter ever. Thank you, too, for the beautiful pictures of snow; Bro. Gary, Fr. John and I felt extremely unhappy to miss the blizzard, for we both enjoy snow days! Our discussions centered around our future, our properties, our elder care and our mission. We shared what each member of our order is currently doing. Additionally, we saw the first draft of a vocation video, highlighting our ministries across the country. - **Second Consultor: Rev. John Christman, SSS** (Parochial Vicar of Saint Paschal Baylon and Art Director for *Emmanuel Magazine*)

We pray for them and continued prayers for the rest of our membership as we live our eucharistic vocation in service to you and the world.

See you later today at the Thanksgiving Prayer Service where I have the honor of preaching for the event at 3:00 p.m. Let us continue to pray for each other and have a blessed Thanksgiving this Thursday!
