
TASTE OF THE TOWN

SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT: This week we look to peace and we lift up the prayers of our children on this second banner in the church. We are grateful to our Catholic day school and PSR students for writing the prayers on the candles hanging in church. They help us and lead us in prayers for peace, in a world torn. We still need the voice of the Baptist – making the way ready for the Lord. Let us practice peace this week, by taking the “higher

road.” At times we may feel that we need to “say our peace,” or say what’s on our mind. Let us recall the Letter of James: Say the things that people ought to hear to build them up in the Lord. That’s creating real peace!

TOWN HALL AND REGULAR STEWARDSHIP REPORT: Due to the holiday publications of the bulletin, we were not able to give you a quick report on several important events. On Tuesday, November 18, we had our annual Town Hall meeting: jointly sponsored by our Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) AND Finance council, for we wanted to focus on the finances of the school and receive ideas to replace BINGO. We were blessed to have a good crowd, with a few parishioners present who are not already on any parish committees or involved in organizations. They came with excellent questions. Here’s a summary of some of the items we discussed:

- Patty Knezevic, our Business Manager, gave some clarifications on the November 2nd bulletin. The printer published \$1,202.98.00 as the bi-monthly amount for envelopes, two decimal points and one comma off. Not 2 commas and one decimal point. I only received 2 comments on this. The correct amount is \$1,202.98. We regularly send our bulletin to the printer correctly – they “proof it” and change things. A question was raised about the contract for the bulletin printer.
- As of today we have 2,365 families registered in the parish. 1,869 receive envelopes. The difference is the automatic donors don't receive envelopes and some elderly parishioners that have moved to nursing homes or into their children's homes no longer want envelopes but want to remain a parishioner "so they can be buried from Saint Paschal".
- The bulk of these non-envelope people are parishioners that have not donated in the last few years but have not told us they are no longer parishioners. Every January the front office goes through the list of people that have not donated in 3 years and remove them from the offertory envelope list. It's a little cost savings, about \$3.60 per parishioner per year.
- On average we receive 600 envelopes a weekend. We also have 93 families donating automatically through our program.
- We are so appreciative for all those who participated in the “Grateful Giving Offertory Enhancement Program.” 14% of the parish participated. 225 parishioners have opted out of increasing their giving amounts due to fixed incomes. 9 parishioners will continue not to give. 315 families are increasing their tithing. We hope to see an annual increase in our collection, by these generous givers of \$102,646.96 by their commitment.
- The Tuition Raffle will be another fundraiser to replace BINGO. This will begin in January and go toward the 2015-2016 school year.
- **Taste of the Town is set for Saturday, January 31, 6:30 p.m.** Tickets will go on sale at the beginning of December. There will be special coupon booklets, auction items and fabulous food from around Northeast Ohio. Tickets are \$45 per person, for an all you can eat extravaganza!
- **Our staff and Finance Council are frugal!** We regularly bid every project, trying to get the best deal for our parish, always negotiating with our vendors.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE continued

We explained how much we have saved in costs over the years, due to our staff reductions, decreases in expenses (where we are able) and our regular bidding process.

WELCOME URSULINE: We are happy to host Ursuline College annual alumna event again this year. They have had to negotiate space at the college due to the July 2013 tornado. They are quickly rebuilding their campus now.

XMAS THEATRICAL LIGHTS ASSISTANCE: Speaking of Christmas, we are always blessed to have folks help with lighting the church with our theatrical lights, during the Christmas Proclamation and after the Mass. Please let me know if you are able to assist us – either Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.

FR. TONY SCHUELLER PREACHES XMAS: Our new provincial superior, Very Reverend Anthony Schueller, SSS will preach our 10 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass, keeping our annual tradition of having extra special preaching for the Midnight Mass – now at 10 p.m. Reminder: In appreciation for our hard working choir and music ministry, and the surveys of parishioners two years ago, we moved Midnight Mass to 10 p.m.

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION: Tomorrow, Monday, December 8 we celebrate our patronal feast for the USA. As proud Americans, let us recommit us to our faith and give thanks to God for the gift of Mary, our mother. See you for this extra holy day of celebration. Let us continue to pray for each other!
