Our Annual Appeals to Support our School

- Over the Christmas Break, due to your generosity this year, we were able to transfer \$17,000 to the Endowment Fund, adding to our \$1.1 million investment for the school. Thank you for making your contribution to assist the school and help us maintain reasonable tuition. Each year a minimum of \$60,000 goes toward school expenses.
- Our GIFTS Program (<u>Giving Is Fundamental To Success</u>) helps bridge the gap between what the actual tuition costs and what we charge for tuition. As of the end of 2014, **\$11,708.00** has been contributed to this fund. 40% of this fund assists in tuition for those in need.

Since January 2014, the committee volunteered hundreds of hours. Input through surveys and interviews from hundreds of parishioners played a vital role in development of the plan. Additionally, students from the Weatherhead School of Management Case Western Reserve University provided input and analysis.

This Strategic Plan is a "living document" that will guide and direct the parish over the next five years and beyond. It builds upon our rich heritage and traditions fostered in our parish.
