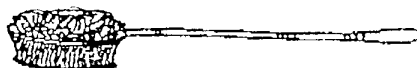

***STILL ENJOYING CHRISTMAS TIME:*** Even though we ended Christmas Time last Sunday, the accolades for all the hard work of our liturgical ministers are still coming in. I am please to announce that we have one Magi (the kneeling one) committed for next year. Of course, we would hope for the other two as well. As Fr. John mentioned in his bulletin column at Christmas, we hope that other parishioners will come forward to donate statues to our new set, from more magi, animals, shepherds, etc. Please see Fr. ***GRATEFUL GIVING:*** Thank you for your stewardship commitment to SPB! Since we began the Grateful Giving Program in October, you have seen how important this program has been for us and helping us maintain and grow financially. We appreciate your continued commitment and how many of you were able to increase your tithing due to your financial blessings. I know many of you also have fixed incomes and many sacrifices – THANK YOU for being faithful to what you are able to do. Our bills increase; with your financial increases we are now able to meet our obligations and start building up our savings again for the emergencies that do come our way on a 62-year-old campus. Each month the Finance Council meets to plan and we are in the midst of finalizing a 5-year maintenance plan. We look forward to sharing more about this.

***CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK:*** SPB parishioners, long timers and new are proud of our award-winning school. Together we all work hard to provide an incredible Catholic education. Thank you for your dedication and support. As we look forward to January 31<sup>st</sup>, *Taste of the Town*, it might be helpful to review some fun facts:

- Last year's fundraising dollars for the school totaled \$106,432.29.
- That gives each student a \$281.57 deduction in tuition.
- If we include the \$75,000 from the Endowment (that was from fundraising over the years) the tuition deduction would be \$479.98 per student.
- Our parish subsidizes or invests another \$237,150 from the Sunday collection. What generosity!!!
- Last year tuition was \$3,995; registration, playground and technology fee was \$200.
