FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Third Sunday of Lent (B): It's been a while since we rotated to using the "B" Cycle of readings for Lent here at SPB. Our Liturgy Commission decided to use these readings at all the Masses this year, as per one of the options for these Sundays. Since Mark's Gospel is so short, we return to John's Gospel to hear about how Jesus drove out the moneychangers in the temple. It's a helpful reminder for us that we build up a temple – the temple of our bodies, and the dwelling place of God. We have a special gift and value. Is it "all about me?" or is it about building the common good and valuing God, family and SPB (or insert the other things in your life)? For too many times in our life, we can become distracted and not remember our purpose and the blessing of who we are as a child of God. Thankfully, Lent and other things in our life help us stay focused and keep our values and priorities in order.

Lenten Eucharistic Prayers: As part of the Strategic Pastoral Plan, this column is meant to also educate you on some of the things we do for and with the Mass. As you know, I love the liturgy and we are so blessed to have such a wonderful team of people serving the worship of our parish. From the priests, the music ministry leaders Julie and Matt and Roberta and all the many volunteers, we are so blessed! It's such a blessing to have us all participating and truly "getting in" to the worship we do.

One of the special things for this time of the year is praying the Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation. They are not usually printed in missalettes or hymnals, but are special prayers, two of the 10 that we may rotate through the Eucharist. I have been asked to share where the prayers came from that I've been using during Lent: They are in the priest's prayer book, the *Roman Missal* and are meant to highlight the themes of Lent, of forgiveness and reconciliation. I have been rotating back between the two "reconciliation Mass" prayers during this holy season.

Children's Liturgy of the Word: Another highlight of our parish is the Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLW) at the 10:00 a.m. Sunday Mass. The Strategic Plan called for us to evaluate, review and expand the CLW. If one does not participate in the 10:00 a.m. you would not know that we have this special ministry when we invite the children to listen to God's Word from the *Lectionary for Children*. The children gather around the altar after the collect of the Mass, and then go to the Eymard Room to celebrate the Liturgy of the Word. They also do an activity to highlight the readings of the Sunday. They return in time for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. CLW comes from the *Directory for Masses with Children*, written in 1973 and is an option for Masses with many children present.

I met recently with the ministry leaders who are doing such an excellent job with this ministry. In light of the goals of the Strategic Plan, we wanted to see, since there are a growing number of families attending the 4:30 p.m. and Noon Masses, if we might be able to offer either once a month at these Masses or even more frequently. The other leaders would be happy to mentor and train you. Let me know if you are interested.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE continued

Lighting Update: Speaking of our “temple” and liturgy, our maintenance staff has done it again – saving us \$\$\$ and working hard to do the work themselves! The lights of the church are slowly going out, as you may have noticed. They are now replaced in the chapel, plants around the altar and perimeter lighting fixtures with the latest LED technology. The cost savings and watt output is tremendous. Thanks Roger and Jon for your hard work on this project. The more difficult project is yet ahead of us --- for we need to replace the fixtures at the 30-foot beam level of the church. Currently that technology, getting the same quality of lighting to illuminate the nave and sanctuary does not exist. However, technology is rapidly changing with lighting. If you have someone you know who works in this field and has suggestions, please let Roger Fisher or me know.

Catechumens – Now Elect of God: We are in the last stages of welcoming new Catholics and this Sunday at the 10:00 a.m. Mass we celebrate the next step, the Scrutinies. There are three weeks of scrutiny prayers to help support the “elect,” chosen by God and the bishop to become Catholic this Easter Vigil night, April 4. Please keep praying for:
