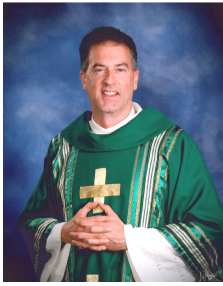
The main advantages to you with MyEoffering are the option to use credit cards to make donations and all the second collections can receive money through your online donations.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...



5th Sunday of Lent: Jesus sets up his Passiontide with today's Gospel reading from John. We hear again the famous remembrance of "unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." We have come to believe and understand that this is quite significant for us, for Jesus died and gave us his life and the remembrance of his life in the Eucharist, an everlasting gift of love. We honor and glorify God by participating in this mystery and seeing that in our own lives, our dying to ourselves and living for others continues to give us life. We continue to "pay it forward," and share the gifts of kindness and care. May our Lenten works of charity continue to glorify God and help us die to ourselves so that we may have new life.

Pilgrimage to the Holy Land: I have been contacted many times since I went on my sabbatical to the Holy Land to lead and be the spiritual leader for tours and pilgrimages to Israel and Jordan. We are blessed that our prayers for peace continue to assist the process; with it now much safer and pilgrims returning, would you be interested in joining with me on a tour this year, November 11 – 22? Usually these tours are around \$4,500, including airfare and most meals. Please let me know of your interest, for we would join with another parish here in Ohio to take this sacred time of renewal together.

Manger Update: Even though we are working and preparing for Easter, our Art & Environment team is working hard on this season and plans for next year. Fr. John will be giving an update on our manger set in an upcoming bulletin. We are pleased that two families (wishing to remain anonymous) have come forward to fulfill the manger wish list.

We are a generous parish! Special thanks to our Ladies Guild for their hard work on the Craft Show last weekend! The compliments from the area continue to come into the office for the hospitality of our staff, volunteers and parishioners. Funds from the Craft Show go toward the special needs of the parish that the Ladies Guild has always met and accomplished. In the recent past, the Ladies Guild supplied the paint to repaint Father O'Brien Hall. Each year, the Guild provides an unrestricted gift of \$8,000 to support the parish's operating expenses. We are grateful for their care and thoughtfulness. With several snow Sundays, a few folks have missed the good news about our other fundraisers. Here's a list of reminders and another "shout out" to thank all the wonderful parishioners who have been tirelessly generous in caring for the needs of the parish, but specifically for the school:

- Taste of the Town final proceeds were \$18,120;
- The Endowment Fund has had \$16,215 in donations;
- GIFTS Program has collected \$15,400 so far this year; This fund supports the difference in the actual cost of running the school and the gap between the tuition and these expenses. 40% of this fund provides scholarship to families who have requested them from the diocese and then our parish matches this scholarship, directly going toward tuition.

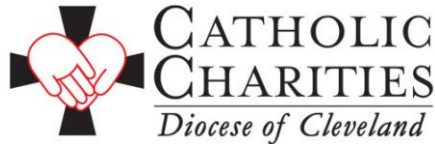
