The original Automatic Donation Program is being phased out and will discontinue in June 2015. We are grateful to everyone that has already switched to **MyEoffering**.

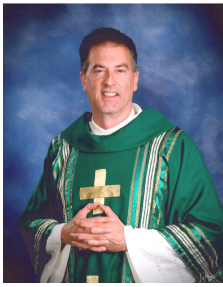
The main advantages to you with MyEoffering are the option to use credit cards to make donations and all the second collections can receive money through your online donations.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



**Our Sacred Holy Week and Triduum:** We begin another Holy Week. Lent passed quickly and hopefully we have seen that our acts of prayer, fasting and almsgiving deepen our sense of the paschal mystery. As we enter into this sacred time, may we walk with those who are unable to walk; may we have our feet washed to share in the passion of those who have no one to care for their feet; may we adore the cross that brings us life for those who are not able to wear or worship the Cross of Christ; may we enter into the sacred Vigil and the time of transformation, igniting a new fire for our faith as we light candles for those who have no light in their lives; may we welcome our new Catholic Christians at our updated font and with them renew our faith and baptismal covenant with God. For our parishioners who are homebound – we celebrate these rites with you in our hearts and minds, praying and walking with you in your passion, death and rising to life. Let us look forward to another week of remembering and reliving our own sacred life.

**Come to the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral:** Each year the special Mass for blessing the oils used for the sacraments in the diocese takes place the Tuesday of Holy Week. Join with the leadership of the diocese on **Tuesday, March 31 at 7:00 p.m.** (Get there around 6:15 p.m. for good parking). We will have three families representing the parish and retrieving the oils for us. They will present the oils during the Holy Thursday service.

**Agape Meal – Potluck Supper:** Please begin the Triduum by celebrating the ancient custom of a potluck meal – Agape – love feast. Bring a nice big dish of food to share. We are grateful for the Aggregation of the Blessed Sacrament, the lay associates of our Eymardian Family, who host this meal every year.

**Looking Ahead to Pentecost:** The ministers and pastors of our Hillcrest Clergy Association meet the First Thursday of the month. It is a wonderful group of women and men of faith; praying, eating and sharing church stories together. You have enjoyed our Thanksgiving Service together and for many years there was a Good Friday service. We decided this year to have an Ecumenical Pentecost Service, praying together for unity and our common faith in the Holy Spirit. Please mark your calendar for **Sunday, May 24, 3:00 p.m.** at Lyndhurst Presbyterian Church (across from Lyndhurst City Hall). In between your travels to family events, plan on an hour of prayer together, remembering how the Holy Spirit guides your life.

**New Passion Booklets:** This weekend we are enjoying the fruits of a yearlong project of Roberta Modica, Senior Accompanist, Kay Vincent and Fr. John Christman, SSS. Roberta had the idea at last year's Palm Sunday to have a special booklet devoted to just the texts of the passion to assist us all in following along. ## EDUCATION

### SAINT PASCHAL BAYLON SCHOOL NEWS

Saint Paschal Baylon Catholic Elementary School has been the recipient of the Governor's Award for Excellence in STEM Education for the last three consecutive years. Here are two more examples of why we have received this honor and why our students continue to succeed.

On Saturday, March 21, 49 fourth through sixth graders competed in the John Carroll University Science Olympiad and brought back 19 ribbons from 17 out of 20 events. Those ribbons included 7 first place showings. Congratulations to all of our Science Olympians and to Mrs. Polantz, Mrs. Baka, and the many parent coaches and volunteers for supporting our students. On the same day at the University of Akron, 4 of our junior high students competed in the District V Regional Science Day and came out winners as well. Seventh graders, Colleen Martin and Daniel Kotrebai earned Superior ratings which qualified both students for the State Science Day. Colleen was also awarded a scholarship to the BWISER summer camp at the College of Wooster. Eighth grader Natalie Thornton received an Excellent rating while Jack Knudson received a Superior rating qualifying him for the State Science Day. The State Science Day will be held in Columbus on May 16, 2015. Thank you to Mrs. Kulick for her continued support of our scientists.
