WHAT IS BEREAVEMENT?

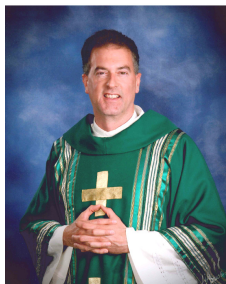

The tomb is empty again, new life dawns and we are reborn in Christ's saving glory. What great news – you can't help but sing "Alleluia" for a long, long time! BENEDICTINE HALL OF FAME

Long-time parishioner **Ed Belin** will be inducted into the Benedictine High School Athletic Hall of Fame on Sunday, April 12th at Windows on the River in downtown Cleveland.

Belin was a two sport star for the Bengals playing on the 1948 Cleveland City Championship basketball team and later that year, the Bengals City Championship football team. He played guard in basketball and was an offensive back and defensive back in football. That Bengals football team completed the first undefeated, untied season in school history with a 10-0 record.

Benedictine defeated Cleveland South 7-0 at the old Stadium to win the football title before a crowd of 45,117, the largest to ever watch the Bengals. Late in the fourth quarter, Belin's pass interception return gave the Bengals the ball deep inside South High territory. It led to the game's only touchdown with less than one minute remaining in the game. After that touchdown, Belin kicked the extra point.
