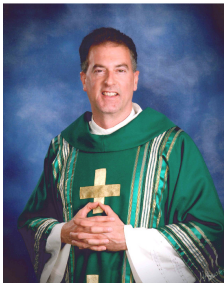

### 8<sup>th</sup> GRADE CONFIRMATION

**2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter:** Each year as we end the Octave of Easter (yes, there are so many ways we count Easter and the season – more on this below!), we remember the gift of reconciliation and peace that Christ breathes on his disciples. Taking a breath to be soothed is key to living in the Risen Lord. Lately, I hear people say, “When it slows down I’ll \_\_\_\_\_ ...” (yes, fill in the blank). That is usually followed up with, “When does it ever slow down anymore?” Today’s Gospel invites us to that process of slowing down, breathing and taking in the peace and serenity that the Easter Season invites us to share. This is one reason why we scheduled a parish holy hour and Taizé Prayer Service on Wednesday, April 29, 7:00 p.m. To take a breath, to pray and to slow down and enjoy the moments that God is hoping for us to share in the joys of this blessed Easter Time.

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**Easter Time:** Yes, you may have noticed a few liturgical updates that the church has given us since 2011. We went from calling it “Easter Season” to “Easter Time,” to match “Ordinary Time.” The other elements are the same:

- 50 Days in the Easter Time – from Easter Sunday to Pentecost
- The Octave of Easter – 8 days in a row of special Easter remembrances – as if there are 8 days of Easter Sunday. The church always likes prolonging the memory and celebration of feasts, especially Christmas and Easter. So, we have 8 days to do this. “8 Days” symbolizes an eschatological meaning, or the importance of us going beyond our own time, space and age and looking forward to the time and age to come.
- Triduum – The holiest season or time of the liturgical calendar- from the *evening of Holy Thursday* to the *evening of Easter Sunday*. This liturgical season, though quite short, overlaps with the beginning of Easter Time.

**Fundraising and Calendar Meeting:** In keeping with our Strategic Pastoral Plan and the last few years of my pastorate, we have collaboratively worked on the parish calendar with our parish leaders. This **Tuesday night at 7:00 p.m.**, we have our annual meeting to look ahead to our 2015-2016 year in light of our new pastoral plan. I’m grateful to our Pastoral Staff and consultants for leading this meeting. In case the head of your organization (we have 62 still in our parish and expect one from each organization to be present to represent the parish ministry) did not forward you the agenda, here it is:

- Prayer
- Introduction of Pastoral Plan Implementation Coordinators
- Calendar Process
  - Why we need this information
  - Revisions to the process (such as requests for set up in advance, new registration forms, maintenance staff present for gatherings of 75 people or more)

- Volunteers for Spring Fling
- Date of Leadership Day: Sunday, September 20
