### WANT TO BECOME A ROMAN CATHOLIC?

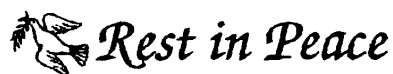

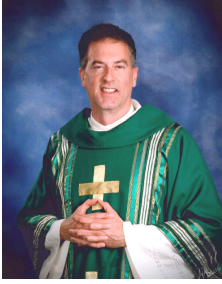

## FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...



**3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Easter:** Like today's Gospel, we are startled when we realize that Christ, our Risen LORD, is also in our midst in the midst of our incredible life journey. No matter how, no matter when, Christ will be there, with his flesh and bones, with his scars and healing words of "peace." This is a common phrase for Easter Time. In the midst of our suffering and pain, Christ is there giving us peace, true peace. We are the witnesses to this and this is the point of Easter Time: to see, experience, believe and share the gift of peace. How wonderful that we are fed this gift at every Eucharist!

**Wonderful Holy Week and Triduum:** As usual, we were blessed with wonderful participation and exceptional liturgical celebrations during Holy Week and Triduum. It was quite moving to see people who have struggled with their health walking in the procession of palms, making another journey with Christ, not letting their aches and pains get in the way of the celebrations. How moving to have so many people, so many feet washed, sharing in the "mandatum" the command of Christ to wash and serve one another. It was very touching to have our Youth Group write and share the modern day interpretation of the Way of the Cross. I was proud of their prayerful and dramatic portrayal of the Stations. We are grateful to them all. How moving it was to witness each present to adore and venerate the cross of Christ. And to know that as other touched the wood of the cross, they were bringing their own pain and suffering to Christ.
