

STEWARDSHIP REPORT

Tithing from April 12, 2015: \$15,597.00 Updated Easter Total: \$56,079.00

Rooted in Faith quarterly distribution check: \$11,182.00

Thanks for your continued commitment to the diocesan capital campaign that is directly benefiting our parish. We were able to pay our HVAC loan a year early due to your generosity. Thanks for continuing to remember your pledge and payment.

Annual Catholic Charities Appeal: Last year 181 Saint Paschal Baylon parishioners pledged \$28,429 through the in-pew appeal. Overall, as of March 31, 2014, our parish was at 104.46% of your \$127,202 goal with \$132,873 pledged overall.

This year only 88 parishioners pledged \$15,098 through the in-pew appeal. While this is fairly reflective of what we're seeing across the diocese, it's not typical for SPB. We are known for our generosity and meeting our goals. Now that the weather is perfect and we are back in our routines, please do what you can to insure that our goal is met and surpassed, but not only that, to help those most in need in Northeast Ohio. LOTS OF News and Info this week: Now that the snow and ice are gone,



people are returning to their usual speeds – which we would like to remind you, are not appropriate for the dogs, children and adults who are walking around the property and some times we miss and do not see. New signs were installed to remind us that SPB is a "10 miles an hour" campus. No need to rush! Take your time, say a "Hail, Mary" or "Glory be" as you drive in and around the property. Of course, there is no texting

while driving – that's a state law. Please also remember that between <u>7:30</u> – 8:30 a.m. and 2:00 – 3:00 p.m., Saint Paschal Lane is a "one way" and that we <u>ALL EXIT</u> on Blue Ribbon Way (between the convent and school) to Wilson Mills Road. Please help us with this "safety zone." And watch who is waving at you – some times it is your pastor! Most times it's Fido wagging a tale or one of our children. Wave back as you enter and leave appropriately! It's the Green Knight way to be slow, friendly and loving in your driving around the campus of SPB!

GREAT Calendar Planning Meeting: It was great to have the following ministries represented at our annual meeting to plan the calendar and hear news of the upcoming year. The groups that were represented were: Finance Council, PTO, Ladies Guild, Wellness, Prayer Shawl, Flock of Friends, Arts and Environment, Music Ministry, Liturgy Commission, School, Pastoral Council, MOMS Group, Community at Prayer, Boy Scouts (Girl Scouts were excused), Women's Bible Study, Youth Group, Spiritual Formation, Athletic Association, Development Office, Business Office, Strategic Planning and the Eymard Spiritual Group (37% of our parish ministries!). While the leaders received the agenda ahead of time, we want to share with you some of the highlights of the meeting:

- We need calendar information by May 19 so that we may open the rooms and space for parishioners who may wish to rent.
- All events that have 75 or more participants need a maintenance staff person present. Please submit room arrangements a month in advance to allow for staffing needs and coordination of room arrangements.
- Even the narthex needs to be reserved in advance!
- It's budget season! New this year is that all parish organizations and ministries may submit budget requests. Due to the transparency required by the Pastoral Plan, any item that is requested for a parish organization or ministry, that is \$5,000 or more must be approved/confirmed by the Finance Council. The Finance Council is selected to be our transparent eyes and fund coordinators. They already examine all parish organization budgets and amounts. If there is something over \$25,000 that is needed for a parish organization or ministry, diocesan approval is also required. We usually receive 3 bids for all items \$5,000 or more.
- The Finance Council is always concerned about Cash Flow for all parish organizations. Many times the communication may be done thru email; however, if a parish organization wishes to address the council at a meeting, they may for we meet monthly. We appreciate all the balance sheets and transparency that is already occurring between the Athletic Association, Ladies Guild, PTO, Rosary Group, Eymard

- Spiritual Group, and Holy Name Society. In the new fiscal year, the Helping Hands Ministry will have regular balance sheets distributed to the Finance Council and membership of this ministry too.
- The next "Quarterly" meeting is Tuesday, June 2 by this point the parish ministries will have made their assignments, responses, questions and concerns given to the Strategic Planning Consultants. They were present at this meeting to explain how we are being accountable to one another and offering assistance to implementing the Pastoral Plan.
- We looked ahead to our annual Leadership Day, <u>Sunday, September 20</u> 12 3:30 p.m.: members felt it would be helpful to focus on the role of the leader and how each leader works best with their ministries. We also want to know how we can be effective leaders and move the group forward, especially in light of the Pastoral Plan.
- All were reminded that a representative from each parish group is to be present for the procession on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>June 7 at the Noon Mass and following</u> for the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. the Very Rev. Fr. Tony Schueller, SSS will be the presider and homilist and lead the procession with the parish groups (1st Communicants too) on this very special day in the parish's life.
- The Parish Picnic is Sunday, August 16 at the Noon Mass at Highland Heights Park. We are grateful to Carol Margevicius for always organizing this event for us.
- Ministry Fair 2016 is the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, January 9/10, 2016.
- We always thank everyone at SPB it's the SPB Way! Every gift to an organization requires a "thank you note." For those gifts that are \$250 or more, a special "501c3" letter is written. During this last tax season, many requested letters with their donation amount, but the Business Office and Pastor's Office had no knowledge of the gift
- I spend some time also asking the leaders present, "If you were pastor, and you had to hire someone new, based on the pastoral plan, what/who would you hire next?" The majority of responses were around two areas: major gifts/endowment/fundraising/institutional advancement and a pastoral associate to assist with communication and the running of the Front Office of the parish, especially working with volunteers.
- Last reminder of the day: this fiscal year all parish fundraisers are donating 10% of their profit, their tithing, to assist the parish, since we have not come up with a permanent replacement for Bingo. There is hope that Taste of the Town could become this permanent replacement, and the committee will have one more consult. Beginning in 2015-2016, all parish fundraisers will tithe to the Manna Ministry and Helping Hands Ministry of the parish.

We have very generous leaders in our parish! They dedicate a lot of their time, talent and assistance to making a great parish run so well! THANK YOU SO MUCH! And thank you for supporting our parish's ministry and organizations by your tithing, your talent and treasure!
