AFTER A MISCARRIAGE

The Catholic Church's Book of Blessings includes an Order for the Blessing of Parents after a Miscarriage. At a time when new parents are facing the worst possible news, the church provides an occasion for them to receive pastoral care by means of liturgical prayer.

When a husband and wife receive the joyful news of a pregnancy, they begin to dream about life with their new child. If the pregnancy is lost, a child dies. In grief, parents may turn to Christ for consolation and strength.

The order of blessing may be led by a priest, a deacon, or a layperson. It may take place at church, in the home or in some other suitable location. After the sign of the cross and greeting, the minister introduces the ceremony. The suggested reading from the Book of Lamentations expresses both sorrow ("My soul is deprived of peace") and hope ("The favors of the Lord are not exhausted"). Alternative readings are suggested Psalm 25 may follow, and one can almost hear the voice of the child in its refrain: "To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul." If the parents or other family members or friends feel able, they may proclaim the readings.

The minister may explain the biblical text, and a series of intercessions concludes with the Lord's Prayer. The minister then offers the prayer of blessing over the parents and may sprinkle them with holy water. The rite concludes with a final prayer of blessing for all who have gathered.

A shorter rite is also supplied, as circumstances suggest. If the family desires, the child could be remembered with a Mass intention and listed in the parish's book of the dead. Especially at times of unexpected grief, Christians look for ways to support one another through sorrow into hope.

June 15 – June 19, 2015 OR June 22 - June 26, 2015

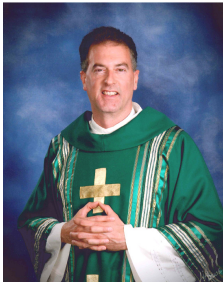

6th Sunday of Easter – NEXT WEEK SPRING FLING:

Easter living calls us to reflect on how we are bearing fruit! Today we remember the commandment that binds us – uniquely binds us: love one another. This sure helps us see our point of service and our point of working hard to have a parish festival. I am so grateful to all who are ensuring a successful festival for next weekend. There is still time for your gifts to be utilized. Also, let's continue to pray for awesome weather.

Improving Our Parish Office: Based on the needs of the Pastoral Plan and the loss of Teri Drda from the Co-Development Director position (she is leaving for personal reasons), it gave the ad-hoc committee and parish office staff some time to reevaluate the needs in the office. I consulted the leaders of the parish at the last gathering and the Pastoral and Finance Council members as well. In light of the consultation and Pastoral Plan we make the following announcements:

- **Patty Knezevic continues as Business Manager.** She works on our payables, receivables, parish records, payroll and HR, diocese reports, ordering of supplies for the Family Life Center and the parish calendar. She assigns the rooms after they are requested. She supervises the front office and manages the priests' schedules, assisting them in their non-sacramental duties. She remains full-time.
- **Kathy Pohlhammer is the new Communications Director.** She remains part-time, but her duties shift a little, taking her strengths and desires for the parish office and building on them. She becomes the bulletin editor. She continues the quarterly newsletter editor (*Paschal Life*), press release and media relations' specialist. She will now also be responsible for all our social media (website, tweeting, Facebook, etc.). She continues her grant writing work.
- **Michelle Mazza** increases from part-time to a full-time Administrative Assistant for the Parish (from just the school to now both sides of the campus). She will be our Volunteer Coordinator, Appreciation Notifier, typing the bulletin and posting it, assisting Patty in the business office and coordinating staff meeting minutes and more. She retains her current school duties, especially attendance and tuition records. She will work in the school mornings, and the parish office in the afternoon. With this job, Michelle will help your ministry coordinate volunteering and also write all "thank you notes." We thank everyone at SPB! We want to make sure we do this well so that every ministry/organization and the pastor/principal will sign and appreciate each gift.
- For hire: **Director of Institutional Advancement:** This position is full-time and the job description is being finalized as we type this bulletin in collaboration with the Finance Council. This takes our Development Office to the next level, helping us work on a capital campaign next year (for the improvements of our campus – details to come as our case statement becomes final), planned giving, major gifts.
