THE OVERALL PURPOSE OF THE LIFE IN THE EUCHARIST PROGRAM & RETREAT DAY

Life in the Eucharist is designed to empower adults within a parish community to:

- A deeper appreciation of the Eucharist as found in the Scriptures and in the teachings of the Church.
- Develop a meaningful understanding of the Eucharist as: Celebration, the Liturgy; Contemplation, Adoration/Prayer; and Communion, living Christ's life.
- Deepen their personal and communal relationship with Jesus as members of the Body of Christ in building up the communal life of the parish.

The method employed by *L.I.T.E.* is experiential and dialogical. It uses song, story, print, small group/large interaction, communal prayer, along with didactic input from program leaders. These structural elements are woven into a learning process that explores the theological, biblical and liturgical richness of the Mystery of the Eucharist in connection with the concrete day-to-day happenings of human existence.

The explicitly spiritual goal of the program is to enable participants to live their daily lives in Christ-centered consciousness. Participants are invited to consider a renewed way of life by:

1. Viewing the power of Christ's passion, death and resurrection as the point of departure for ongoing personal growth and religious development;
2. Promoting personal prayer and adoration as a vital means to instill the fruits of the Eucharist in one's life;
3. Forming a team of Eucharistic evangelizers to present the *Life in the Eucharist* program in their parish or wherever God calls.

An Overview of the Day:

SESSION 1 - EUCHARIST: GOD'S LOVE AS NOURISHMENT IN JESUS CHRIST

In preparing the input for this first session, it must be emphasized that the celebration of the Eucharist is a communal meal event during which God's

hungry creation is fed with the Food of eternal life – Jesus Christ – in Word and Sacrament.

SESSION 2 - EUCHARIST: GOD'S LOVE AS RECONCILIATION IN JESUS CHRIST

In the second session, the Leader explains how the entire celebration of the Eucharist is a reconciling event for the faith community. We go to Eucharist not to have our sins forgiven, but rather to receive and experience the reconciliation that is ours in the proclamation of the Word and in the remembering of Christ's passion, death and resurrection.

SESSION 3 - EUCHARIST: GOD'S LOVE AS TRANSFORMATION IN JESUS CHRIST

The input for the third session presents practical guidelines for the individual believer and the faith community that show them how to insert their present life situations into the transforming reality of the manifold presences of Christ that are made accessible in the Eucharistic celebration through the actualizing and spiritualizing power of the Holy Spirit. This session wants to elucidate what full, conscious and active participation might truly look like, as well as describing the psycho-spiritual benefits that can flow from such participation.

SESSION 4 - EUCHARIST: GOD'S LOVE AS THE ABIDING PRESENCE IN JESUS CHRIST

With this third session, the investigation of the first element of a contemporary Eucharistic spirituality, namely the celebration of the Eucharist, is brought to a close. The fourth session introduces the second necessary element of a contemporary Eucharistic spirituality: contemplation. It will focus in on contemplation, especially as it relates to prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.

SESSION 5 - EUCHARIST: GOD'S LOVE AS MISSION IN JESUS CHRIST

The final session is a **celebration of the Eucharist – our very own Mass within the Retreat Day**. The homily during this Eucharist will focus on God's love as Mission in Jesus Christ. The participants will be asked to become actively involved in the preparation of this Eucharist in which the participants have a chance to take part. A presentation is given focusing on the theme of Eucharist and mission. The goal is to draw out from the lives of 20th century men and women (e.g., Thomas Merton, Dorothy Day, Pedro Arrupe, Teresa of Calcutta and Oscar Romero) the role the Eucharist plays in the conversion-to-justice process that is the Gospel prerequisite to genuine communion with the suffering. This Mass will serve as your Sunday obligation for Mass.

The day ends with a meal together. Come for all or part of the day!

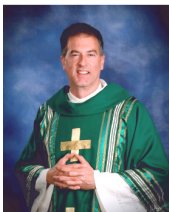

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...

Due to the holiday schedule, this bulletin was compiled on June 25.



We are blessed to be in a parish that is always having a lot of ministry and services occurring all year round – and with even more summer events! Bible Camp was a tremendous success due to the hard working team of volunteers, mostly our youth group members. Practically every participant had an older youth mentor. What a wonderful witness to one another as they spread God's Word in many ways. Special thanks to Evamarie Mickol for her hard work and efforts and Angie Perrine.

Special Thanks and Tithing: As I type this column, a few of our ministries are having their “year end” meetings to distribute their fundraising funds to the parish to support it and our many ministries, especially the school. You may recall that for two years, the Finance Council asked fundraising events tithed to the parish 10% to make up the difference in ***not*** having BINGO and this regular fundraising income to the school. So many people worked hard and always dedicated their love and care for SPB thru our fundraising activities. The fruits of their labors pay off well:

- Athletic Association tithing gift: \$1,700
- PTO tithing gift: \$3,700
- Ladies Guild tithing gift: \$2,000 (and this is above what they already donate for the annual contribution to the parish's life of \$8,000)
- Ladies Guild gift to the Rosary Makers: \$200
- Ladies Guild gift to the Manna Ministry: \$500

And to those who are contributing to the Endowment Fund, to help our operating expenses of the school – much thanks! With this bulletin, we are in a new “fiscal year” for the parish's life. Last year, with your support, and the interest from the Endowment Fund, we were able to contribute \$75,000 to the school budget – that's keeping the tuition lower by \$200 per student. THANKS!!! All our hard work “pays off” in sharing our resources and building up our parish's life.
