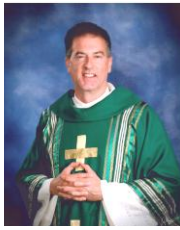

LIFE IN THE EUCHARIST PROGRAM & RETREAT DAY FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...



19th Sunday in Ordinary Time: It is hard to hear something prophetic from someone you have known for a long time – especially since childhood. Jesus is faced with this impossible task of having people know his family roots and yet share with his religious family the truths about God. We find it difficult now to hear the truth about things, such as if the doctor tells us health concerns, our family is concerned about our welling being, how we spend money, how we vote, and the list can go on and on. Hot button issues are hard to learn and take, but once again we recognize that at the Eucharistic table, we are confronted by God's truths and true life. We continue to pray that we be open to conversion and change within our hearts, not just during Lent, but also throughout our life as God reveals the meaning of our life.

Implementing Another Piece of the Pastoral Plan: We had the great opportunity over the past two weeks to have **two** Triduum events for the saints of our parish. Not everyone is able to get away for a retreat or a vacation: we are blessed to have so many dedicated parishioners who helped us to grow in our faith by having the Saint Ann Triduum and Saint Peter Julian Eymard Triduum. Especially last weekend, I was so proud of our youth and adults who led the "Life in the Eucharist" (LITE) retreats – simultaneously in different parts of our campus and at times together. Both leaders (youth and adults) were trained to share their faith and experience of the Eucharist and moved us with their special grace from God. You may not be aware that we actually sent a group of youth to Orlando with our youth minister, Evamarie Mickol, and other parents, to be trained by other youth who have participated in the LITE retreats in Florida. Evangelization and family faith formation is at work in our parish, especially with how our youth inspired their peers in relying on God and trusting in the graces of the sacraments, most importantly, the Eucharist. This weekend after Communion, we will have some of our LITE teens share a reflection on the Eucharist. Many thanks to our youth and adults who participated last weekend – over 75 -- and to Jim Brown, Director of the Center for Eucharistic Evangelizing, Fr. Tony Schueller, SSS, our Provincial Superior and Evamarie Mickol, our Youth Minister, for their leadership and guidance in the Triduums of the last two weeks. Thanks to our homebound parishioners for their prayers to make these events such a success!

Questions about the Mass: Continuing my question series about the Mass: The dialogues! As you may have noticed, the Mass is very much a "call and response" experience. We "dialogue" back and forth with liturgical greetings that are quite important and date back to the beginning of the rites for the church's worship. They are essential for our participation in the Mass – the priest can't preside at Mass without a person to respond; it is important to have a "community" sharing and "acclaiming" God **together**. With the recent update of the Mass in 2011, I learned more about these dialogues but especially about two important ones: The Mystery of Faith & Great Amen. Did you know that the priest is not to sing or say these two responses? That was something that was made clearer to me, like the other "call and responses" of the Mass. The People of God, the participants in the Mass, have these **key phrases** to sing (or say) and expressing faith and acknowledging what the priest proclaims during the Mass. The priest celebrant is the leader of the dialogue, but not the responder to the phrases.

Even the cantor leads us in “calls and responses,” such as for the Dismissal of the Children (“Go in peace.”), the Dismissal of the Catechumens, Litany of Saints at baptisms, the Universal Prayers, Lamb of God Litany, etc. These are key moments for the congregation/assembly to express themselves and praise God. At each Mass, remember how important the respective parts are to the Mass and boldly proclaim that which is ours to speak – and may your “Amen” proudly express your inner acceptance and belief in who we say we are, “The Body of Christ,” especially at the end of the Eucharistic prayer, our great prayer of thanksgiving.

Construction in Progress: Each summer we do our major projects to get the campus ready for a new school year. Projects are rapidly happening just before the new school year, namely the replacement of the concrete around the handicap entrance (SE Narthex), removal of the old art/science module building and return to a green space, adding a convenient walkway to the Family Life Center and the moving of the school office in the Family Life Center from the old one. (This old school office is the new art classroom.) The SE Narthex concrete will now have heating coils to make it less of a hazard in the winter. Thanks for your tithing that supports these projects that are almost complete (as of the typing of this column).

Some SSS NEWS: Deacon Joe Returns This Week & Fr Roger Bday: As you know by now, we SSS help one another out and cover for each other when there are special needs. Deacon Joe went to San Antonio for two weeks to cover for Fr. Mario (our 6th pastor of SPB) who was away. Thanks for all your birthday gifts to him for the remodel of his office – come have a tour of his office and see the wonderful work that Bob, Roger, Donna and company did to bring Deacon Joe’s office to the 21st century!

Also, this next weekend on Sunday, please join in wishing Fr. Roger a very happy birthday! We are grateful for his assistance, support and care of all of us here at SPB and Saint Ann Shrine.
