

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...



24th Sunday in Ordinary Time: "Who do people say that I am?" We ask that question of one another regularly out of a sense of finding out if we have a favorable opinion. Jesus uses this opportunity in today's Gospel to draw out the faith of the disciples – Peter, you and me! We are reminded that our faith leads to a journey with our cross. Faith without the cross is meaningless, for the cross helps us lose our life and gain the Gospel to save us!

Part 8 - Why We Do What We Do at Mass:

"Ite missa est." I'm sure a few of you remember this famous phrase in Latin that is loosely translated into English: Go, you are sent! This week I thought I would reflect upon the dismissals we have during the Mass. The word "Mass" comes from this dismissal rite – that we are "missioned" to go and live what we have celebrated. It's odd to many of us, that the last thing the priest celebrant would say would become the very thing that names what we do, but this is what happens. We go to live the Gospel, to live thanksgiving (in Greek, we say "Eucharist") to live the "mystery of faith" and make the Body of Christ come alive in the world.

<u>CLW:</u> Last week we talked a bit about the "extra" dismissal of the Communion Minister to the Homebound and other places. This week I wish to mention the other dismissals that have been added to the 1970 Roman Missal. The first one was added in 1973 with the Directory for Masses with Children. This penultimate document, a first for the church's history, gave a way to incorporate young people in Masses and special ways to adapt the liturgy where there are children present or have their own special Mass. Unique was the advocating of the Children's Liturgy of the Word, that we have done at our parish since 2009 at the 10:00 a.m. Sunday Mass. The children "are dismissed" to go and listen and celebrate God's Word with their own special lectionary, a book translated into the language of children. These children are "sent" to have God's Word celebrated in a special way and with an activity, during the homily time, to further develop the theme of the readings. This is why you see the children return for the Liturgy of the Eucharist with a special coloring or craft piece.

RCIA: The other dismissal that was added to the liturgy occurred with the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults* or the RCIA, in 1988 when we "dismiss" the catechumens and candidates preparing for becoming Catholic. This ritual of dismissal returned from the 4th century catechumenate, when the first part of the liturgy was called the "Liturgy of the Catechumens" and not the "Liturgy of the Word," as it is now. Those who were not able to receive or participate in the Eucharistic Prayer, whether because of penance or preparation for initiation (baptism, confirmation and First Communion) left to reflect on God's Word or just went home, nourished at the Table of the Word. So in 1988, this part of the Mass returned, where Saint Paschal Baylon follows this ritual during the Catechumenate and Elect Periods of the RCIA. (Some parishes dismiss all year long, every Sunday and at all the weekend Masses. We are not as big of a parish and do not have the need and follow one of the options of this dismissal).

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...

Being "sent" reminds us of the importance of what we do – whether it is to listen to God's Word; to leave to ponder God's Word; to go and share holy communion with those not present or to leave and go and live the Eucharist. We are all on a mission to fulfill our call and bring Christ to others. We "do this in memory of Him" who sends us all to "take up our cross and follow Christ."

<u>Coming Events:</u> Our parish life has kicked back into full gear, especially with Education/Formation. I hope you will take advantage of the opportunities, especially that which is mentioned at all of the Masses this weekend with learning about Saint Peter Julian Eymard and a Eucharistic Life. Also, coming up is learning about what Fair Trade means, Taize Prayer and our special mission to El Salvador (in October).

NOTE the Room Change: We are all enjoying the new School Office that is part of the Family Life Center (FLC). To accommodate this move, the parish is now "leasing" meeting room space in the north wing of the SSS building, that is, the former Saint Ann Shrine rooms. Some of us older parishioners may recall when we used all of these former seminary classrooms as meeting rooms for parish activities. We will now have two meeting spaces, one will be for the Youth Group and the other will be the Sr. Dorothy Kazel, OSU (our local martyr) – moving this room name from one building (FLC) to the other (SSS) in memory of her. This is a special anniversary year, for it was 35 years ago, December 2 that she gave her life for the Gospel. She was "sent" to bring the Good News of Christ and fulfilled her dream to her death. We honor her and her life-giving memory in this special space that we hope to begin using this week. Meanwhile, it's great to see more people at church each week. Worship is a team effort – we can't do it without you! See you next Sunday at Mass and until then, let's continue to pray for each other!

PARISH COUNCIL CORNER - The last day of August saw the second Council meeting for the month. (No meeting in September. Next meeting – see below.) Father Lane shared information from the CARA Report (Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate | Georgetown University); special sections on "Catholic Education" and "U.S. and Worldwide Statistics". Father also reminded us that Fr. Scott Steinkerchner will preach here in October on our parish and diocesan commitment to the Church's mission in El Salvador from his perspective with Food for the Poor. The culminating action will be a parish mission trip to El Salvador during Lent.

The main meeting focus was a discussion of the Parish Leadership Day to be presented on Sunday, September 20, beginning at the Noon Mass, followed by lunch and work sessions.
