26th Sunday in Ordinary Time: The reason why the Pope planned on coming to the United States was to be at the quad annual church meeting for the family in Philadelphia. The church has World Youth Day, Eucharistic Congresses and this meeting on the families every four years is to keep the world engaged in the mission of our church. The themes of the World Meeting of the Families are: Love is Our Mission; The Family Fully Alive. To paraphrase Saint Therese of Lisieux, our mission is to love, to be loved, to make love loved. This is God's plan and it is our mission. May we celebrate this gift of love and share it with others in the many subtle ways we are able.

Part 10 – Why We Do What We Do During Mass – The Processions: The processions of the Mass remind us of a key gesture for us – we are walking with our cross and following the LORD. At key times of the year we still have processions where we **all** may participate, such as Palm Sunday, Easter Vigil and the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We always have processions at baptisms, weddings and funerals, reminding us of our “faith walk” and the journey we are on as pilgrim people. We are continuously traveling back to our heavenly homeland, and it's key that we have these moments in the liturgy to remind us of that.

The entrance procession of Mass is a chance for us to see the ministers of the Mass live this pilgrim journey and represent us. The rubrics for the procession have been as few members as you see at our parish, to as many as the choir and Communion Ministers. I remember as a child here at SPB, the Communion Ministers and lectors were all in the procession when these ministries first allowed to be celebrated with lay people. The procession can reflect the diversity of the community and that's why at some churches they do have many ministers and people join in this Introductory Rite.

The second procession for the Mass is the “offertory.” The work of our hands, given to us by God, is brought up. The gifts are bread and wine, but they are representative of us – who we are and who we hope to be - as a changed, transformed person, as the bread and wine are changed and transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) 73 says, “Even though the faithful no longer bring from their own possessions the bread and wine intended for the liturgy as was once the case, nevertheless, the rite of carrying up the offerings still keeps its spiritual efficacy and significance.” This is why we have the altar servers with candles lead the procession of the gifts – “our gifts.” Some parishes across the globe then have their community come forward to bring their monetary offering to baskets in the sanctuary, to process and share their offering. Gifts for the poor may also be processed in during this time – as was the custom from the Acts of the Apostles.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE - continued

The third procession is the communion procession. It is accompanied always by song, for we are to sing – to signify as GIRM 86 says, “the Communion song is meant to bring out more clearly the ‘communitarian’ character of the process to receive the Eucharist.” As pilgrim people, wishing to be fed and nourished by God, we come forward proudly, singing, holding our arms out to make a throne for God of our hands. Christ’s hands were nailed to a cross for our salvation – it is these same hands that have known pain that are now touched and healed, Sunday after Sunday.

Each of these processions culminates in the ultimate procession – the one to live our faith in the world. We go forth in mission to live the Gospel, carrying our cross on this pilgrim journey of life, until we reach our final destiny! I bet you didn’t realize how important your “walking in faith” is! No matter our physical condition, we journey onward and upward!

CLOWN AND HELPING HAND MINISTRY

I wish that the Pope would visit our church for he has said, "I want churches to be poor for the poor" and certainly Saint Paschal is doing what he has said. This past Wednesday, like every other Wednesday, our Helping Hands cooks come in the afternoon to prepare a very enjoyable hot meal that is then served to the needy. This meal, clothing and other items are given to the homeless who live under bridges and abandoned buildings. On Thursday, we have a group of Helping Hands members separate clothing and load the vans for our Saturday ministry to give the homeless. This past Saturday a group came in early to prepare and feed those in need at Saint Vitus Church. That same day, another group of Helping Hands members donated their time from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. preparing hot meals. Then, the next group came in at 1:00 p.m. and took the meals and clothing to the homeless. The down-pouring rain didn't stop our ministry from helping the very needy. Despite all the rain on Saturday we were able to feed more than 200 homeless. When this soaking wet group of Helping Hands members arrived back at SPB on Saturday evening smiles were still on their faces knowing that even in bad weather conditions they still are able to do their job, and that is to help the needy. This past week we were able to clothe and feed more than 300 homeless. We are a church for the poor and without these very dedicated volunteers, this would never be able to happen. The Pope would be so proud of this parish and this parish should be so proud of all the donations that are given to this ministry, and also the very generous volunteers who give so much to God's needy people. Thank you and God Bless all...Remember God is Love all the time and all the time God is Love. **HELPING HANDS IS IN NEED OF:** Clean clothes for men (Large and up T-Shirts, Sweatshirts, Jeans sizes 32/34/36, sneakers sizes 9 ½ and up, gloves, hats, hand warmers and long johns).
