PSR NEWS – PSR Registration: If you haven't yet had a chance to register for PSR, registration forms are available in the parish office or online at psr.saintpaschal.com. Tuition rates for this year are \$95 for 1 child, \$175 for 2 children, and \$255 for 3 or more children. **Scholarships are available.** Additionally, our registration form also serves as the emergency medical form as well as the media release form for your convenience. **Special note:** Two years of sacramental preparation is required. 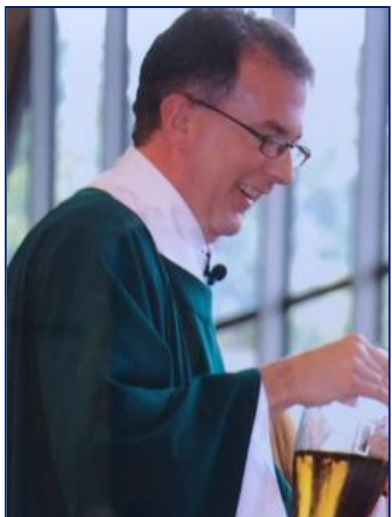

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Respect Life Sunday: As Michelle Francl-Donnay says in *Give Us This Day*, for this Sunday:

These readings point us to realities beyond marriage, challenging us to deepen our fidelity to one another and to Christ as members of His One Body. This indeed is a hard teaching for all of us, not just those struggling with marriage. Are we torn open by the sufferings of our brothers and sisters? Do we weep for each other as we would weep for a beloved spouse? We are no longer two, but one flesh.

These striking reflections from her come from the experience of her losing her husband and invited her into a deeper reality of why we respect life – from the unborn to the elder – everyone’s life is sacred! This is why our church devotes not just one Sunday, but every day to proclaiming the sanctity of life, tirelessly making sure everyone knows God’s gift of life. We work for the unborn, to those on death row. We believe and work tirelessly for the Body of Christ! One Body – one in Christ! I applaud those who volunteer and passionately work to make us aware and work for this justice, especially members of our own For Life Committee. Let us continue these efforts with them.

Copies of “The” Book: I am aware that not everyone is available to come to our events at SPB, but especially to the daytime sessions we offer, such as, the Eymard Spiritual Group (ESG). Copies of this book that I wrote while on sabbatical, about the Eucharist outside of Mass, are available for purchase in the front office. This is not a fundraiser. We are selling the book at cost. I shared an interesting part of publishing this past week at the ESG: Writers usually do not make commissions anymore – we get a flat fee and that is all! FYI: The Blessed Sacrament Community received payment back in 2009 and 2012 for this project.

Xmas Manager: Father John and the Art & Environment Committee are pleased that two families came forward to donate the Magi for our new crèche scene. Last year we began the creation of the new set, with our hope for families to purchase animals for the scene as memorials. The current goal is to purchase a camel for the Magi – and if your family is interested, please see Father John immediately so that it may be purchased in time for this year’s Christmas scene.

Food for the Poor with Us in Haiti: Unfortunately, our hopes to go to El Salvador have been dashed with the current fighting in the city of San Salvador and Food for the Poor is not taking trips to this country. They have offered us the opportunity to go to Haiti instead, traveling there February 22 – 26, 2016. In a few weeks, Fr. Scott Steinkerchner, OP, with Food for the Poor (and in the interest of full disclosure, a childhood friend) will be preaching here at SPB for us to raise funds to contribute to bettering the life of the people we will meet in Haiti. FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE - continued

Stewardship Report: We continue our goal of transparency. Please notice that from time to time, we will share our regular bills that we pay as a church. As you heard from Finance Council members last weekend, we are grateful for your continued offertory giving, sharing your sacrifices with God who has blessed you!

Part 12 – Why We Do What We Do During Mass – Why We Use Incense:

We know from Psalm 141 how incense has always symbolized our prayers rising to God. Every major religion uses these grains of “frankincense.” Believe or not, in the history of Christianity it was NOT used at the beginning of our worship for it was “too much like the pagans.” It wasn’t until Christianity became a legal religion, later in the 4th and 5th century that it became customary for Christian worship. It is a sacramental, like holy water, that leads us into the deeper mysteries, reminding us that the world is sacred in sights and smells. One practical purpose for incense in all religions was to cover the bad smells and disease of people when they did not bathe regularly. We use the incense during the “high holy liturgical seasons,” funerals, prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament at SPB (and not all year round as they show on TV Masses) to highlight, as I have mentioned before in this column, the “progressive solemnity” of the liturgical year and the importance of certain moments of our worship/prayer. We highlight the importance of God’s Word and the Eucharist by incensing during these times during the Mass. We also use incense in the processions to highlight our “faith walk,” as I mentioned last week the importance of processions.

Thanks for praying, worshiping so well here at SPB. The music team and priests are always amazed how interested you are in worship, singing so well, and wanting to grow in our faith/worship traditions. Let us continue to pray for each other.
