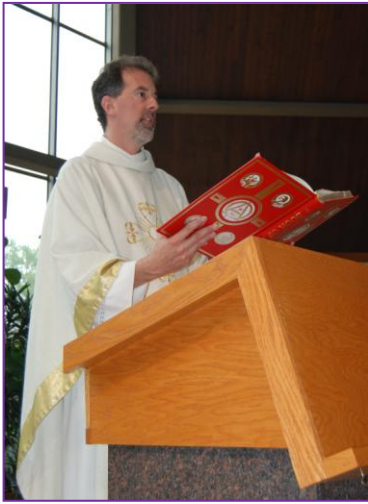
Here are some great things happening this week:

Stewardship Report: We continue our goal from the Pastoral Plan of transparency. Please notice that from time to time, we will share our regular bills that we pay as a church. As you recently heard from Finance Council members, we are grateful for your continued offertory giving, sharing your sacrifices with God who has blessed you!

Part 13 – Why We Do What We Do During Mass – The Colors: One of the altar servers said it best recently, “I love Mass because of the various colors I get to wear!” She was talking about the cincture, or the Catholic belt/rope that goes around the server’s waist. We have these colors to indicate the liturgical seasons of the year. In the Roman Rite (or Latin Church) our color scheme has been a bit different than the Eastern Rites or even the other Western Rite, the Milanese/Ambrosian Rite. [In Milan, Italy, their Ordinary Time color is red – where we wear green. I think that they wear red due to the wonderful sauce they wish to promote! (OK – once in a while I get to throw in a Catholic joke!)] I was told once they wear red to remember that the blood of Christ and love of God freely flows through the most important days of our lives. We wear green, based on tradition, for this season of hope and joy. Violet (in our tradition) has been worn for penitential seasons, such as Lent and Advent. The hues of violet have varied with bluer violets for Advent and redder/purple violets for Lent. White is for the holy seasons of Christmas, Easter Time and memorials of saints. Red has been always worn to symbolize the Holy Spirit and martyrs, especially Jesus who gave his life for us on the cross. Each day is a different color, which is why we share with you a liturgical calendar to know the colors to wear to church ahead of time. Not only the lectors, communion ministers, altar servers and priests wear these colors --- all may wear them to Mass, for we are all Eucharistic ministers, sharing in Christ’s body and blood and His Real Presence among us.

Let us continue to pray for each other.
