29th Sunday in Ordinary Time: You have heard the phrase, “Be careful what you ask for!” This is a warning in our Gospel today from Jesus. We hear that one answer we get from the LORD is to “serve” and “give our life for many.” Is that what we ask? Perhaps not, but it is helpful to realize that we are each servants of God and in our own special ways, we are called to deepen that service and see that it is an offering for others, and offering to God. Our baptism calls us to ask for a deeper sense of our call and service of one another!

New lectors & Communion Ministers Needed: Speaking of service, how about liturgical service? It’s fall recruitment time – and we are training new Communion Ministers for service at the altar of Mass and lectors to proclaim God’s Word. Unfortunately, a few of our liturgical ministers are no longer, due to health reasons, able to serve at Mass. Won’t you take over for them and assist? Please come to our training sessions – **next Saturday at 10:30 a.m. in church** for Communion Ministers and **Saturday, November 7 at 10:30 a.m. in church.** These meetings are also for our current ministers as we review some things together and improve our service. We are blessed to have so many who freely give their time to these ministries.

Curious About the Church? We start our “fireside” chats for the curious and questioning tomorrow night in parlor of the parish offices. Please park in the horseshoe lot for **Catholic Questions & Answers** – with the Evangelization Committee and myself at 7:00 p.m.

Oktoberfest? Taste of the Town & Anniversary Raffle: Many thanks to so many who have already turned in their raffle tickets to benefit the school. Have you bought **your ticket** to Taste of the Town? We moved Taste of the Town so that you would have an enjoyable evening of great food and drink, Christmas shopping to support the school thru the auction of incredible basket packages that have been put together, and friendship and fellowship! We merged the Oktoberfest with this event, so you will still get to enjoy the great potato salad and homemade sausages made by our 10:00 a.m. Adult Choir. Reserve **Saturday, November 14** for this is the place to be – Father O’Brien Hall.

Food for the Poor with Us in Haiti: Unfortunately, our hopes to go to El Salvador have been dashed with the current fighting in the city of San Salvador and consequently, Food for the Poor will not be taking trips to this country. They have offered us the opportunity to go to Haiti instead, traveling there February 22 – 26, 2016. In a few weeks, Fr. Scott Steinkerchner, OP, with Food for the Poor (and in the interest of full disclosure, a childhood friend) will be preaching here at SPB for us to raise funds to contribute to bettering the life of the people we will meet in Haiti. If you would like to be part of this trip – an experience of learning, building and sharing ourselves with those in need – please let me know ASAP. We will meet with Fr. Scott about the trip **Sunday, October 25, at 1:30 p.m. in the Fr. Arkins Conference Room (in the parish offices).** Do some good this winter – have others join us if you are not able to go – so that we escape some winter here to be of help down there!

Part 14 – Why We Do What We Do During Mass – BELLS? With the reform of the Mass in 1970 bells were not used for the Eucharistic Prayer. In 2011, bells became an option again for the Mass to remind us of certain moments in the Eucharistic Prayer that are special to us – namely the institution narrative. Why may you use them or not? When the prayers were recited in one’s native language, it was no longer to announce or let people know what was going on during the Eucharistic Prayer. Secondly, and perhaps even more importantly, the church wished to emphasize, like in the Eastern and Orthodox churches, that the entire Eucharistic Prayer and not certain parts are very special, holy and need to be emphasized. Since we do not ring bells during the entire prayer, use of them at these certain moments stopped. Interestingly, incense is called for during the entire prayer – as a sign of our prayers rising to heaven, with someone asked to kneel in front of the altar to incense. We do not use this custom of incense here at SPB, but during the Weekday 9:00 a.m. Mass, we do ring the bells out of respect for a custom/tradition that is dear to many.

Speaking of bells, we have a special gift coming in time for Christmas! In honor of Fr. Louis Bourgeois and Deacon Joe Bourgeois, SSS, a special donation to thank God for these men and their witness of service to the church is being given – a new electronic bell system. We used to have them here at SPB – ringing to announce the time and prepare us for Mass. Birds, squirrels and the sun aging the wires ruined them as well as the speakers that sat on the top of the church. They were not replaced until now. You may recall that a year ago, after the installation of the memory gift for the baptismal font, I mentioned a list of other memorial gifts that included bells. In the coming weeks, the bell system will be installed. Once the entire Bourgeois Family is able to come together here, we will announce a special day for blessing the bells. Deacon Joe mentioned to me how his brother loved bells, especially the evangelization nature of them, ringing/announcing for people to come to Mass. We look forward to this sound returning to SPB and are grateful to God for this special gift in memory of Fr. Louis and in honor of Deacon Joe. They will be known as the “Bourgeois Bells!”

Incidentally, additional funds from this special donation will support our Helping Hands Ministry, for the poor. As with all our gifts to the parish, part of our tithing and care always continues for the poor and this ministry here at SPB. We are proud that every fundraising event here tithes 10% to the poor. We request that with each memory gift there is an inclusion for the poor and our Helping Hands Ministry.

Let us continue to pray for each other and ring out a joyful noise to the LORD in praise for God’s many gifts to us!
