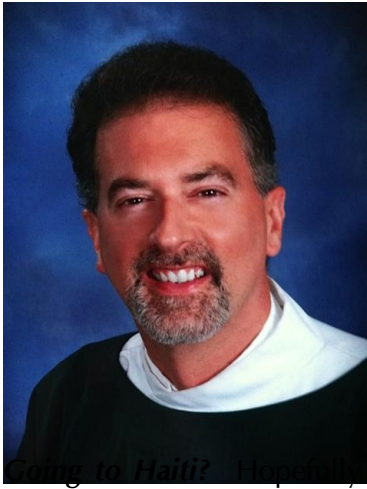
## PSR AND CONFIRMATION NEWS FROM THE PEKO'S

**Part 15 – Why We Do What We Do During Mass – Posture?** Occasionally visitors and guests ask why we stand during the Eucharistic Prayer, since this is not their experience in their church. Kneeling became common in the United States when pews and kneelers were added to churches in the late 1800s. If you have ever been in an Orthodox or Eastern Rite church, there is no kneeling. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), the instruction manual for Mass, does state that the preference for the United States is to kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer (see paragraph 43). However, for a good reason, you may stand (also in paragraph 43), for those physically able to do so. Our good reason for standing is that we do not have kneelers. This is a common reason why many churches stand and we do the same posture: as a sign of unity (see paragraph 42 of the GIRM), all who are able are expected to follow the posture of the community and the priest – the "when in Rome, do as the Romans do" model. For those who feel we might not be reverent during this time, I always like to point out the other two key times when we are expected to stand during Mass – during the proclamation of the Gospel and during the Communion Rite. Posture, reverence and other elements of the Mass are always culturally determined. What one country or culture finds reverent, or appropriate, others may not. Some countries sit on the floor, as there are no pews. Other places would never kneel due to the persecution that it reminds people of their experience.

The vesture colors are culturally determined for in some countries or cultures white is used for death, while in our country, people tend to wear black. Back to posture, we stand to acknowledge the presence of Christ and give reverence to Christ when we hear the Gospel, when we receive communion and sing the communion song, and also when we proclaim the Eucharistic Prayer. (Our country has always stood to show reverence – think of a courtroom, “All rise!” Some may recall that at one time the priest knelt to pray the Eucharistic Prayer and many parts of the Mass before Vatican 2; now the priest and people stand for these key important “Christ” moments.

Thanks for helping others understand the importance of this sign of reverence in our Mass today – standing in the position of Christ and what the early Christian community’s posture was for centuries, to show reverence and respect to Christ. With the regaining of the importance of our heritage, in 1970 the church returned to the posture that our own culture does to show reverence, when we stand to greet one another, with a handshake or to give respect to a leader, judge or other important dignitary. The Mass is about the most important person – Christ! Christ gathers us as the Body of Christ, and for this we give thanks and stand to praise!
