SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS: Every few years we have the joy of celebrating this great solemnity on a Sunday. It is a wonderful occasion for us to focus on our call to sainthood – that “we are God’s children now” and “blessed.” As we begin the month of November and think of Thanksgiving, it is an opportunity to look at our Christian vocation and thank God for the gift of our life. Let us help others see their blessedness and invite them to join with us at Mass to celebrate “the kingdom of heaven” is here! “Rejoice and be glad!”

New Lectors & Communion Ministers Needed: Speaking of service, how about liturgical service? It’s fall recruitment time – and we are training new Communion Ministers for service at the altar of Mass and lectors to proclaim God’s Word. Lector training is **Saturday, November 7 at 10:30 a.m. in church.** These meetings are also for our current ministers as we review some things together and improve our service. We are blessed to have so many who freely give their time to these ministries. There was a question about dipping the Body of Christ in the Precious Blood. The USA bishops have asked that there ***NOT*** be intinction of the Eucharist, that is, **no one is to “dip” the host and put it into the chalice.** There are two reasons for this – one theological and the other practical: Jesus’ command was to “take and drink.” The other reason is that there is worry that there would be spillage of the Precious Blood when it is transferred from the host to chalice to mouth. There is to be no drops falling onto the floor. Thank you for respecting the custom of the USA. We are very encouraged that more people are receiving the Precious Blood.

Part 16 – Why We Do What We Do During Mass – Making a Throne? Above in the recruitment paragraph there was actually a Part 16 about intinction – but now here’s another issue – receiving Holy Communion in your hand or on the tongue. For the beginning of the writings about receiving communion, many church leaders, notable Saint Augustine, Saint Cyril of Jerusalem and Saint John Chrysostom comment on proudly displaying your hands to make a throne for receiving. Please do so! And loudly say “Amen” so that the Communion Ministers hear you – and God hears you! You may smile to show your gladness and joy! Sing – for we sing to proclaim our thanksgiving in song!

For those who receive on the tongue – which you may – we kindly ask you to extend your tongue and open your mouth wider to make it easier for the minister to place it on the tongue. We appreciate this so that we will not have people nip or bite the communion ministers’ fingers. Many Communion Ministers, like me, find it difficult to place the host on the tongue for there is not enough space for us to safely place it on the tongue. Also, say “Amen” **FIRST** before sticking out your tongue.

We say, “we are not worthy...say the word and we are healed.” We are worthy to receive the LORD and to have Him placed in our hands, the same hands that are anointed, that show the hands of God. Proudly, reverently and joyfully come forward to receive what you become – the Body of Christ! And say our “Amen” magnify our gratitude, adoration, joy and thanksgiving to God, the living God!
