She and the front office handle all parish business and financials only – so that the priests are able to focus on the spiritual matters of the parish.

***SPONSORS TO SUPPORT THOSE BECOMING CATHOLIC:*** Each year, people move into our parish who do not know anyone, nor have a sponsor or godparent to help them become Catholic. A sponsor is someone who accompanies a person along the journey to the sacraments. They are a person who has completed the sacraments of initiation and have a good knowledge of the faith, but no degree is necessary! You come to our RCIA sessions (this year on Thursday nights) and support the person with helping them know the faith better and stand with them through the rites of the RCIA throughout the year – mostly during Lent and the Easter Vigil. Please discern if you would like to share your faith – and then contact George Peko 440-442-3410 extension 107 or me to learn more.

**Part 17 – Why We Do What We Do During Mass – Special Rites?** For those becoming Catholic, whether as an infant or as an adult, the *Rite of Infant Baptism* and *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults* (RCIA) celebrates them in the context of the community and the Sunday Mass. The rites assume that the parish family is gathered for a Sunday Mass – and of course, we are blessed that we are able to do that here at SPB. When there are these rituals, there are special adaptations that are possible – and you see these happening regularly at SPB. Why during a Mass? The assumption is that everyone will renew his or her covenant with God by the reception of Holy Communion. Secondly, witnesses of the parish family need to be present to welcome, affirm and accept the newly received in to the church. In two weeks, we will welcome those who are becoming Catholic in the first step and ritual of the RCIA – the “Rite of Acceptance.” Just as in the infant baptism ritual, the sign of the cross is placed on the forehead and other sense and parts of the body to claim the person who is becoming Catholic for Christ. This is why we continue to make the sign of the cross with holy water on our foreheads when we enter the church – to remember when we first put on Christ at our initiation in to the church – whether as a baby or as an adult.

Let us continue to pray for each other!
