## CLOWN/HELPING HANDS MINISTRY

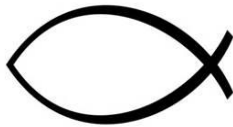

## FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



***Pastoral Council Suggestion Box:*** Each month we open the suggestion box in the narthex and have had questions more than suggestions for improving the parish. As I did two months ago, the Pastoral Council thought it might be helpful to answer some of these questions in the bulletin. One question came in after the meeting and opening of the box and it is one that I would like to share with a broader audience.

### ***Why do the crosses/crucifixes change in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel?***

When I first came to SPB almost 7 years ago, I had 17 listening sessions and many suggestions and concerns were shared with me, including that people had donated religious objects and never saw them in the parish, specifically crosses and crucifixes – especially for the chapel. I mentioned this at the beginning of my pastorate and stated that I would rotate the images, monstrances and crosses for the chapel – and so we have.

### ***Let's pray for Pope Emeritus at Mass.***

Actually, he asked us not to do so – following the rule that when a bishop or priest retires, we may for health reasons pray for them, or when they died, but they are not mentioned as part of the liturgy anymore. He wished for us to keep this liturgical mandate for himself too.

### ***Confessions are scheduled to 4:15 p.m. – a priest should be in the confessional until 4:15 p.m.***

In a perfect world, yes! However, many times I know that I am called to assist with something in preparation for the Mass and there has not been a line for the confessional – so I leave to attend to other parish business. If there is another person who comes, we always return to the confessional.

### ***Have a booth at Spring Fling from Monastery Greetings.com – a Cleveland Company.***

Any organization or company may have a booth at Spring Fling. Have them contact our Spring Fling committee – and we will share with them the registration fee information.

### ***Pray for peace and have ecumenical events, potlucks with our Buddhist Temple on Ridgebury Road.***

Actually, they are not a temple, but a “service center.” They do not worship at this site on Ridgebury Road but like our Helping Hands Ministry, provide opportunities to do service work in the area. In fact, they do come and assist us with our Helping Hands Ministry – as well as the Armenian Orthodox Church. We do have an interfaith potluck each year – it is on February 15.

### ***You are the only adoration chapel [sic] that closes on holidays. Others are open 24/7 & 365.***

Unfortunately, we do not have people here to pray each day of the year, especially on holidays. Our leaders for Community at Prayer have been told by the people who pray that they will not be available on holidays – therefore, we do not have the rite of exposition on this day. For those who know the code, the chapel is always open for prayer, whether there is exposition or not.

***It is terrible that you make senior citizens walk so far to church on Holy Days of Obligation. Children should play inside so we can park closer to church.***

Agreed! This suggestion is something we regularly do. It was an oversight this December 8 – and we hope that you will forgive us.

***Hold the host and wine [sic] high so the people can see it.***

I thought I was tall enough – but at the appropriate times during the Eucharistic Prayer there are three points to the three elevations – one lower, one medium and one high. Hopefully, with some of the priests, who are not as tall as I am, you would move forward to have a better view.

With the recent liturgy survey, there will be an opportunity for Father John and I to share other information and rubric notes. We appreciate your questions, comments and suggestions. Meanwhile, enjoy Catholic Schools Week – and thanks for spreading the word about our award-winning school.

## ADDITIONAL COLLECTION

**ADDITIONAL COLLECTION FOR VICTIMS OF SEVERE WEATHER** - The diocese has asked us to take a collection for those across the country who have suffered due to the recent severe weather.
