FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Our Great LENT: We begin our solemn fast and counting of the days of LENT today after the “vestibule” or preparation days that Ash Wednesday thru Saturday allow us. Anything serious we do needs preparation – and so the church gives us the days before the First Sunday of Lent to prepare. Now, this Sunday we look at how Jesus prepared himself for His ministry, and the temptations that He faced in His life, but specifically when He was fasting. Let us realize that in our fasting, praying and almsgiving we will have temptations – ones that are designed to challenge us. The devil will be there to trick and make us deny God and turn toward things that are not good for us. That’s why it is called a temptation or sin!

Let us also realize that we do this **TOGETHER!** We are in this Lenten journey of prayer, fasting and almsgiving together, to be more faithful to our baptismal call. Each of us, on a journey of faith to renew our covenant with God (and the church!!!) relies on the support, care and love of one another. We show the face of God to each other through our encouragement and care. THANK YOU for all the encouragement and support you show others and me, as we work together for the glory of God, improvement of our lives and witnessing Christ to each other and our world.

Year of Mercy: Our Art & Environment Committee has a great idea and is working with our students to decorate our church, but also provide an opportunity for penance. We are all preparing though, and the idea for our common penance this Lent, inspired by the Pope, is that we will do an act of the corporal or spiritual works of mercy. Our students will write on a cross what penance they will perform; therefore, showing their works of mercy. Let us think of what we will do for our penance and to fulfill this great gift of living the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

What should I do for Lent? Regularly, I have folks ask me for suggestions, so here is an opportunity for me to share what are “basics” that will help you in your life:

- Join us for Weekday Masses – 9:00 a.m., (including Saturday) Monday/Wednesday at 12:15 p.m. and Tuesday at 6:30 a.m. or the Shrine celebrates at 11:30 a.m. on weekdays
- Join us for the Liturgy of Hours – 20 minutes of prayer either at 8:00 a.m. or 4:45 p.m. in the chapel
- Join us for the public recitation of the rosary – 20 minutes, 8:30 a.m. Monday – Saturday; we also recite one decade of the rosary with the school faculty, weekdays at 7:30 a.m.
- Make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament or join one of the regular hours of prayer in the chapel, Monday – Friday
- Participate in the Stations of the Cross, Fridays at 7:00 p.m.
- Join in the parish mission February 27 – March 2 (see the notice elsewhere)
- Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Wednesday, February 24, Saturdays, or by coming to the parish office (call the office to make sure that the priest on duty is present, for some times we are away at an emergency call)
- Call a friend; visit the sick; volunteer in a ministry to share, live your discipleship and faith

Search Committee for the Pastoral Associate for Music & Liturgy: Each day someone asks me for information about the process that we follow at SPB. I thought it might be good to share how we fill positions, but especially this position:

- Invite stakeholders in the ministry to be part of a search committee through a consultation of the staff, a particular ministry and the outgoing staff person.
- The pastor appoints the committee members and a chair for the committee based on the feedback of parishioners who volunteer.
- The search committee meets, familiarizes themselves with the parish needs, reviews the pastoral plan and creates a job description.
- A job description is posted online.
- Applicants apply to the chair of the search committee.
- The search committee meets to design questions for the interview process and the strategies. These meetings occur online and in person.
- The committee interviews the candidates and makes a recommendation to the pastor for hire.
- The person selected completes a final interview and assessment with the pastor and the Diocese of Cleveland. Virtus training and State criminal background check is reviewed. For some positions, a psychological test and background test is necessary.
- When the entire process is finished, the candidate is hired and a date is selected for the hire to begin.

We are currently interviewing candidates for the music/liturgy position. We hope to interview all the candidates by Easter. Yes, there have been several who have applied; one who initially applied has withdrawn from the process due to the demands of the job description. Continue to pray for the process. As we journey into Lent together, especially with our candidates and catechumens who are preparing for the Easter Sacraments, and will be attending Mass at Saint John Cathedral this Sunday evening with me, let us pray for them in their final weeks of preparation.

During Lent, our students have opportunities to celebrate Mass, attend Stations of the Cross, and receive the sacrament of Reconciliation.
