Pope Expands the Foot Washing: You may have heard the Pope Francis has

expanded the universal church the “Mandatum” or Foot Washing. Many dioceses and parishes, out of respect to everyone, now includes women and a diverse membership of a parish, in this ritual, since it was revised in the Holy Week reforms of Pope Pius XII (1955). However, the Latin text specifically said “men” only would be in the ritual and some parishes and dioceses were strict and did not allow women to have their feet washed. Pope Francis has instructed pastors to share with their parishes the reasons he has updated the ritual for the universal church:

- The rite is not obligatory part of the Holy Thursday service, but rather something to be carried out “where a pastoral reason suggests it” (see *Roman Missal*, Mass of the Lord’s Supper, 10). *At Saint Paschal Baylon, it has been our custom since the renewed liturgy has been celebrated here with a variety of people having their feet washed.*
- The rite has been part of the Roman Rite since the 7th century, being emphasized in many monastic settings.
- Since the 17th century, the custom of washing the feet of the poor on Holy Thursday has occurred.
- The rite comes from Jesus’ words at the Last Supper (John 13: 14) – I give you a new commandment (mandatum), that you love one another as I have loved you... that you do as I have done. We have continued the Eucharist and foot washing based on Jesus’ command.
- “The pastor [or in SPB’s case, the Liturgy Commission] chooses a select small group of faithful to represent the variety and unity of the people of God.”

Since Fr. Mike Arkins has been pastor, we have had parishioners chosen to represent specific groups within our parish and society and have us respond to why we “wash their feet,” remembering our service. We have also included everyone to participate since I have been pastor, as is the custom in other churches. This has allowed for the Confirmation students, and everyone who is present to have their foot washed by one who has already had their foot washed. In doing so, we are continuing the “cycle of service,” and reminding one another, that once we are ministered to, we then go and minister to others. I hope you’ll exercise the option and allow us to minister to you by having your foot washed during the service – and if you wish, you may also wash another person’s feet, imitating our LORD.

Sacred Triduum: The Holy Thursday liturgy is so very special, one of the great nights of the Triduum. I hope you'll be able to take time off to be present for this celebration, as well as the other two days of the Triduum, Good Friday and Easter Vigil. Here are some other highlights that I love about the Triduum, this unique; one liturgy spread over three days:

- The presentation of the Holy Oils for the sacraments through the year. This takes place at the beginning of Holy Thursday's service.
- The procession with the Blessed Sacrament. For many years we have processed from the church, through the cross alley to the north of the property and along the Blessed Sacrament Community building to the Shrine of Saint Ann chapel for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament until Midnight. We invite you to come pray, even if you have not attended the service, to pray in the chapel for a few moments to an hour. The chapel will be open for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 9:30 p.m. until Midnight. Make a visit before going to bed and beginning the solemn Good Friday rituals with your family.
- I am edified by the Youth Group that presents Stations of the Cross for us on Good Friday at Noon. **JOIN IN THE SPECIAL SOUP LUNCH** they will serve *AFTER* the Stations **in the EYMARD ROOM.**
- I enjoy the veneration of the holy cross. Fr. John and I especially love the ritual of processing in with the cross and having everyone participate in the veneration with their own sign of reverence.

Our Annual Potluck – Agape Meal: This year, the small faith-sharing groups (called ARISE) will be joining the Agape Meal. This “love meal” is open to everyone as a way to keep the memory of the early church's potluck gatherings. Please call the parish office to register and find out what food to bring. Just as Saint Paul remarks on the Lord's Supper in the scriptures, we keep this additional tradition alive in our parish, starting at 5:30 p.m., March 23 in the Eymard Room. We are grateful to our Aggregation of the Blessed Sacrament (the lay associates/SSS) that hosts this event each year.

Please come and bring a Friend! Our parishioners who brought a friend to the parish mission and found SPB to be so welcoming enlightened me. Please attend these meaningful liturgies of Holy Week and the Triduum. Take this opportunity of a spiritual renewal/retreat. I look forward to celebrating these events with you, especially as presider and homilist, but also, in a very special way, during the Easter Vigil, I am able to be a godparent to two and a sponsor to life-long friends, joining the Catholic Church. Let us all keep evangelizing, living our faith and inviting! Our gentle ways of including everyone bring Christ to others!

Let us continue to pray for each other!

BLOOD DRIVE NEWS - Saint Paschal's next blood drive is scheduled for Sunday, April 3rd, from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. in the Eymard Room. Here are some things you should know about LifeShare Community Blood Services:

- LifeShare is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization, founded in 1948.
- Although it's based in Elyria, 60% of the blood collected by LifeShare is sent to hospitals here in Cuyahoga County.
- Because all charitable blood collection services are regulated by the FDA, LifeShare's process and guidelines for donating blood are virtually identical to those of the American Red Cross.
- LifeShare has established an educational grant program which rewards successful blood drives with grant money for an affiliated school -\$500 for every 25 blood donations. This can add up to a significant benefit for our students!
- Another benefit for regular blood donors is LifeShare's "Loyal for Life" Rewards Club. Repeat donors may qualify for gift cards of \$20 or more for multiple donations in a one-year period.
- LifeShare's website at www.lifeshare.cc indicates which specific blood types are most urgently needed at any given time. You can also use this site to get answers to your eligibility questions and/or to schedule an appointment for our upcoming blood drive.
