Weekly Update - SPB Spring Fling Festival Planning Central (SPBSFFPC). T minus 6 weeks. We have so much to talk about this week, but so little space to do it in, but here we go.

This year we are using the internet as our primary means for registering volunteers. Please visit <http://church.saintpaschal.com/> and look for the Spring Fling tab in the upper right corner of the page. You will be able to see all available openings and sign up for all those spots of interest with one click of the button. If you do not have access to the internet, manual signup sheets will be available shortly.

Raffle ticket sales are a little behind this time last year. We think that this is primarily due to the early Easter season. If you have not done so, and judging from sales, many of you have not, please consider purchasing 1-2 books of tickets. This is our "weather insurance policy" which will net us over \$40K. It will also take the pressure off our "Car Talk" meteorologists on loan from NPR, Wayne Goaway and Claudio Vernight. The weekly \$60 drawing of returned ticket stubs begins on Monday, April 11th.

Lastly, Festival sponsorships are still available starting at \$50 all the way to \$5,000. These sponsorships help to defray the over \$18K in fixed expenses we incur to put on the Festival. All sponsorships that are in by the 15th of April will be listed on a flyer that will go out to 25,000 homes in the Sun Messenger and Sun Press for 2 consecutive weeks in May.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Third Sunday of Easter: Today's Gospel reminds us of "the first breakfast," the day of the resurrection. The disciples went back to their "old routines," and here in this account we have Jesus Christ making a breakfast. What a great image! What a way we can start our day, eating with the LORD. So often we turn on the radio, TV or other media device to fill our day with the latest news – and stuff. It seems to me that we are invited to a deeper relationship; so let us have our Easter Time filled with these moments when we just sit

with the LORD and allow him to fill us up on the greatest meal of all – a conversation of faith and love.

LITE Retreat: May I suggest a way to fill your life and enjoy some time with the LORD is next Saturday's Life in the Eucharist Retreat Day (LITE)? Our LITE Team of both adults and youth are placing before us a day to feast on the LORD'S goodness in our life and reflect on this great mystery. Sign up on Monday morning.

New Sidewalk in: Our new cement sidewalk next to the SE Narthex (handicap entrance) was completed in time for the cement to dry – but not for the heat coils to be installed. So, as Mother Nature would have it, our first test, last weekend with the crazy thunder snowstorm didn't allow us to test the heat coils. I am happy you enjoyed the new smooth surface; the ushers shared with me your delight in this improvement.

Other Capital Improvements: I appreciate the brainstorming that has started as we look to our next improvements for our campus and the needs. I included a list two weeks ago in the bulletin – and other items have already surface as important, and I add them to our list:

- Safety/sidewalk from Colony Drive along Saint Paschal Lane to the church
- Church Lighting Update at the 30-foot level beams (the current bulbs are not being manufactured anymore). [The perimeter of the church has been retrofitted with LED lights.]
- Updating and reorganizing the Father O'Brien Hall kitchen
- Outdoor classroom, utilizing the courtyard space
- Resurfacing the church parking lot and replacing the driveways (Saint Paschal Lane and Blue Ribbon Way)
- Replacing the single-pane windows of the church
- Replacing the floor in the Eymard Room
- Replacing the canopy to the Family Life Center (damaged by multiple truck hits to the structure in its 16 - year history)

PSR AND OTHER NEWS FROM THE PEKO'S

Registration: Be on the lookout for PSR registration forms for the 2016-2017 school year. Forms were sent home with current students this past week. Additional forms will be available from the Parish Office and on psr.saintpaschal.com. To avoid a late fee, please register as soon as possible. Early tuition rates for this year are \$85 for 1 child, \$155 for 2 children, and \$230 for 3 or more children. **Scholarships are available.** Additionally, our registration form also serves as the emergency medical form as well as the media release form for your convenience. **Special note:** Two years of sacramental preparation is required. If you have a child entering 1st grade or 7th grade and are interested in them receiving their sacraments in 2nd and 8th grades the following year, please make sure to enroll them in PSR for this coming school year.
