Each year on the Sunday after Pentecost we take time to study, pray and understand our relationship with the God who reveals in three persons. I find it interesting when we each pray; we have different ways of addressing God. I hear some people say, “Dear Father,” others, “Jesus, my brother,” and still others, “Holy Spirit, touch my heart!” No matter which way we address God, we do so in an attempt to grow closer to the mystery that has yet to be completely revealed. Like life, our God takes time to unfold until we completely grasp the mystery when we will be reunited with God.

Spring Fling! Thank you for joining us for our 7th annual parish festival. We are blessed to have so many people come from northeast Ohio and northwest PA to join with us during this special weekend. We are also honored to have Deacon Joe’s family for the formal blessing of the Bourgeois Bells. Being the first parish festival in the area gets everyone into the mood of being outside, visiting friends and neighbors, having some fun food and listening to great music and dancing! Every year our event gets bigger, better and our team grows and develops great fun for us. I thank Bob Mastrangelo for his leadership of our committee and being chair. From our staff, Kathy Pohlhammer has worked tirelessly, especially on the flyer and publicity that I know many people have enjoyed seeing this year. Our Advancement Director, Barb DiTurno, was instrumental in expanding our sponsorship this year. We are so grateful to the doubling of sponsors this year – please patronize our sponsors and tell them often how grateful you are for their care of our parish. I also give a shout out to the rest of the committee for their hard work and dedication: Don LoPresti, Bob Horvath, Greg Sutyak, Jim Bartel, John Margevicius, Kris Martinson, Mike Majernik, Diana Mitchell, The DiLillo Family, The Reichert Family and Teri Drda. We appreciate that Athletic Association, PTO, Ladies Guild, the Welcome Committee, Holy Name Society, SPB Credit Union, Helping Hands, Parish Council, Parish Finance Council, SPB Day School, SPB PSR and the Eymard Spiritual Group are as involved as they are too. I hope I have covered everyone – but if not, I apologize.

Why DO We Fundraise? Besides the fun, we do “fun” raise for additional “funds” so that our parish may use these funds for specific projects or reasons. We have been working at using our funds to pay down our loan on our roofs for the school, gym and Father O’Brien Hall. As we look ahead toward bigger projects, we know that we will have to raise funds to cover the “big ticket” items. I have been creating a “working list,” a brainstorming, as it were, to be able to help us begin the process of prioritizing “what’s next” and necessary for the growth of the parish. I appreciate the few people who have entered into the brainstorming with me. Here’s the list up to now:

- Updating and reorganizing the Father O’Brien Hall kitchen and remodel of the hall
- Outdoor classroom (learning lab), utilizing the courtyard space of the school
- Replacing the science module building with a permanent science lab
- Resurfacing the church parking lot and replacing the driveways (Saint Paschal Lane and Blue Ribbon Way)

- Replacing the single-pane windows of the church with double-pane windows for energy saving
- Replacing the canopy to the Family Life Center (damaged by multiple truck hits to the structure in its 16-year history)
- Adding another meeting room and medium sized space, especially during the school day, to have for funeral gatherings
- Remodeling the parish offices
- Update the Eymard Room Kitchen

Over the summer, Barb DiTurno, our Advancement Director, will be working on a feasibility study with us – and we are asking for your input and support to learn, brainstorm and determine “what’s next.” Nothing has been decided or finalized. By October we hope to check out this plan with our parish leaders at a special meeting, Tuesday, October 11. This “Quarterly” meeting will give guidance and direction for the next steps. At that point, we will share with you the results of the feasibility study. I hope that his paragraph helps outline for you the process for studying and seeing if we are ready for a capital campaign.

Procession with the Blessed Sacrament: Meanwhile, we always need more prayer to help us manage our parish’s life. Won’t you join with the parish leaders, our First Communicants and all our regular parishioners in participating in the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, next **Sunday, May 29** at **NOON**. After the Mass, we hope to process around the campus for annual special devotion to the Eucharist, telling the entire world how important the Real Presence of Christ is for us in the Eucharist.

Let us continue to pray for each other! Thank you for being part of our parish festival weekend and supporting the good work of SPB. Thank you Saint Paschal Baylon for being our patron saint, of food, festivals, cooks, kitchens and the Eucharist. You are a great witness for us as we live our faith in the modern world!

Scholarships are available. Additionally, our registration form also serves as the emergency medical form as well as the media release form for your convenience. **Special note:** Two years of sacramental preparation is required. If you have a child entering 1st grade or 7th grade and are interested in them receiving their sacraments in 2nd and 8th grades the following year, please make sure to enroll them in PSR for this coming school year.
