On the first Monday of June, Council met for a potluck picnic and a brief business meeting to end the fiscal year. Amid clouds of fragrant smoke, Fr. Lane presided as host and grillmaster. The many great contributions made for a delightful shared meal.

The business portion included farewells and thanks to three wonderful members whose Council terms are completed: Joe McCormack, chairperson, Kay Vincent, recording secretary and Moira Popelka, SPB School faculty representative. Their faithful service and great contributions of time and effort to the parish are truly appreciated and will be missed. We also welcomed a new member, Bill Horvath, coming to Council from the Finance Commission.

Two finance related items were discussed:

- The Spring Fling was very successful, due to the excellent planning and work of the committee: bills are still being paid, and a full report will be published in the Bulletin, but the final profit may be as much as \$10,000 more than last year!
- The SPB School finances and budget for the new fiscal year are in such good shape that the usual subsidy from the parish will not be needed!

Finally, Fr. Lane has been approached by representatives of the Legion of Mary, a national Catholic Marian organization, asking if there are parishioners interested in establishing a chapter here. If you are interested in working to bring the Legion of Mary here, please contact Fr. Lane.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



13th Sunday in Ordinary We begin the Time: second part of the call to "take up our cross daily and follow Christ." Jesus is following his path and his followers are trying to be helpful. Jesus, on his way to Jerusalem, goes from place to place and foreign lands, inviting others to the same This is our journey. journey and we encouraged, as always, to stay faithful to the path.

<u>Attend the Year of Mercy Convocation:</u> A special flyer is in the bulletin – please make a special retreat as part of your Year of Mercy devotion and enjoy this special weekend.

Pope Francis has awakened our vocation to be of service, especially in this Year of Mercy. We participate well in the corporal works of mercy, but here's a look at the spiritual ones to work on these this summer:

- 1. <u>Council the Doubtful</u>: Encourage members of your family to belief, to love God and their faith. There are so many things we cannot see for sure just look at how we try to see into our bodies and experiment with healing and surgeries, etc. Faith helps us deal with our doubts.
- 2. <u>Instruct the Ignorant</u>: Of course one could also become a PSR Catechist- but we need not look any further that ourselves and families. Look into the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* or good web searches to stay current and knowledgeable about the faith and the church.
- 3. Admonish Sinners: This is a tricky one for we know how some may come off as "holier than thou." Gently, we are called to correct one another in love. Sometimes we have to say through our own witness how we learned, "God would forgive us for …" Encourage folks to avail themselves to the sacrament of reconciliation and share how you enjoy the benefit of this sacrament and the grace that assists you in living a better life.
- 4. <u>Comfort the Afflicted</u>: Support one another through your presence, a call, visit, email or text.
- 5. <u>Forgive the Sinner</u>: Find this one hard? Bring this person to be <u>your</u> intention for Mass. When you see the priest break the bread during the Fraction Rite, allow God's love to break through into your heart and the other person's heart so that God's love and presence will assist you in the healing process.

- 6. <u>Bear Wrongs Patiently</u>: Rather that telling everyone over and over again what happened and who erred, just be silent. The LORD knows that's all that matters. Again, silence can be golden and bring us peace rather than stirring up the heart over and over.
- 7. Pray for the Living and the Dead: Not only when we wake or go to sleep should we pray, but at other special times of the time. Join in the "official" praying times of the church, with the Blessed Sacrament Community for Morning Prayer when we join in the praise and prayers for the living and the day or Evening Prayer when we pray in thanks for the day and remember those who have died. We live in a special communion with heaven and earth: come and pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament once a week, for a special 15, 30 or 60 minute time of living this "communion" between heaven and earth in the real presence of Christ.

<u>Teen Choir Still Sings in the Summer:</u> Many things wind down for the summer, but, if your life is like mine, "it's just getting started," and the song "ain't" true: Summertime and the living is Easy! There is even more things to do in the summer!

One of the joys of my life is playing and singing with our Teen Choir. Just a note that our Youth Group Teen Choir will continue to sing each Sunday at the 7 p.m. Mass. We are blessed to have a dedicated group of singers- - more are always welcome! Join in the practice before Mass, starting at 6:15 in the music area. Roberta and I will be rotating as keyboardists for the summer months.
