From the desk of Fr. Roger

Fathers' Day, June 19, 2016 was a historic day for the Cleveland Cavaliers and the city of Cleveland. Still recuperating from surgery for an inguinal hernia, I too, like a million others around the world, was glued to the TV and the SHOT that cemented the basketball championship victory in the final minute.

Professional sports championships have a way of being aborted in Cleveland, but not this time. A flash of Cleveland Pride and Spirit accompanied the actions of the players on the court, and the entire city seemed to absorb the teams' victory and make it their own. As CHRISTIANS now, let us ask ourselves, have we absorbed and made Christ's victory over Evil and Sin our victory? The death and resurrection of Jesus is both His victory and ours. Jesus is our Hero and we should not hesitate to tell this wonder to the world.

By definition, a priest forever does NOT retire. His duties and responsibilities may be less and different, but his commitment to serve God's people remains always the same.

So what am I doing now that I'm "actively retired?" For some twenty five years, I have ministered as part of the SPB parish staff, and continue to "help out" for occasional Masses, Confessions, Funerals and Weddings when requested. I'm happy to offer the Eucharist monthly at Brookdale Home for Seniors and at Aberdeen Crossing, as well as being "guest priest" often at the Ursuline, Notre Dame and Carmelite sisters' mother houses.

Do you know where the Chapel of St. Ann's Shrine is? It is tucked away at the end of the East Wing along Wilson Mills. I have recently been asked to be Chaplain for St. Ann's Shrine Chapel and the daily Eucharist celebrated there Monday thru Friday at 11:30 a.m. St. Ann's Shrine is the development arm of the Blessed Sacrament Congregation in the USA. Either myself or another SSS priest, are happy to welcome anyone to this quiet and inviting place of prayer and worship. Before the Mass on Tuesday, we offer devotions to Good St. Ann, mother of Mary and grandmother of Jesus, we pray for healing of the sick and other personal intentions, and offer her relic for veneration. There is an outdoor handicap accessible entrance to St. Ann's chapel, and an indoor one via the parish office. All are welcome!

These are some of the ministerial things I do to help me become and remain the person and priest I am. Pray for me and all priests, please.

15th Sunday in Ordinary
