FROM A PARISHIONER'S PERSPECTIVE

Why do I take extra time to pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in my busy life?

As I grew older and wiser, I started wondering what my purpose in life was. This led me to my basic catechism of knowing, loving, serving our Merciful God and the mysteries. I realized that it is impossible to please God without having faith, one does not have to fully understand to believe since we walk by faith and not by sight. Also, the Eucharist is the source and center of the Catholic Church's life. Truly, God is everywhere but Catholics believe in the special substantial, continuous and real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and Blessed Sacrament. This is one of the fundamental differences between Catholics and other Christians.

It is a blessing to belong to a parish with the Blessed Sacrament Community (SSS) that offers many opportunities to adore our Lord. I learned about the four great ways of Eucharistic Adoration which are Adoration, Contrition or reparation for the great evils in the world, Thanksgiving and Supplication (ACTS). My literature search illumined my mind to incredible benefits and power of the Eucharist as testified by numerous saints like Saint Peter Julian Eymard, an apostle of the Eucharist. We are called to educate ourselves and do more than go to Mass only on Sundays. If we truly believe in Transubstantiation during Mass, it follows then that Jesus is continuously present in the Blessed Sacrament, so that Eucharistic adoration is a natural consequence of our Eucharistic celebration. Each time we look at the Host, we are looking at Jesus, who loves us unconditionally so that it is then fitting to spend some time to adore Him more intimately and reverently.

Personally, I experience pure joy after my visits to the Blessed Sacrament. I cannot forget when I was faced with a tough and seemingly hopeless situation. On this fateful Saturday morning, after humans failed me woefully, I cried bitterly and drove to talk to Jesus in our Blessed Sacrament Chapel. I poured out all my heart to Him and by the time I left, I had an incredible inner peace and was immediately led to an individual who helped me beyond my wildest dreams. I marvel at His Love! Jesus hears, answers prayers and bestows graces on us and the whole world! Also, I was used to praying in a nondenominational chapel in my workplace and was thrilled the first time a priest walked in and opened a wall closet only for me to see a hidden tabernacle! Since then, I visit Jesus every workday and this has deepened my relationship with Him. I thank God for revealing this to me.

I am convinced that we can give a few minutes or hour of love and adoration in return to all Jesus does for us, for being with us always, to present our needs and fears, those of others and the whole world. Sometimes, one hour goes by too fast because there is so much to pray about during the supreme act of adoration. Saint John Bosco said that if you trust all things to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and to Mary Help of Christians, you will see what miracles are. Won't you join me in this prayer commitment?
