

GUEST COLUMN-FR. JOHN CHRITSMAN, SSS

By now you have undoubtedly seen the large red banner in the sanctuary. Brother Gary has made this and all of the other signs throughout the property announcing our religious gathering around the theme, "The Gift of Self in the Year of Mercy." Next weekend there will be a series of talks and liturgies here at Saint Paschal's that will explore these important ideas.

The occasion for this gathering is the anniversary of Saint Peter Julian Eymard's deep spiritual insight, "the gift of self." After many years of prayer and contemplation Father Eymard developed a unique spirituality. He loved God so much, and so strongly desired to give himself completely to God, that he wanted to give something more. Beyond the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience he wanted to give something even more meaningful to God. He wanted to give his very self to God. He called this spiritual gift, "the gift of self."

Of course as we well know as Christians the greatest thing we are called to do is to love God and to love our neighbor (Mark 12:30-31, Luke 10:27). Therefore, giving the gift of ourselves to God also implies giving the gift of ourselves to our neighbor. This Father Eymard understood completely as he gave his life to the service of God, his religious community and the people of France where he lived. Father Eymard's insight teaches us that there are opportunities to give the gift of ourselves every day and in all of our encounters. We can give the gift of ourselves to help family and friends, to avoid unnecessary conflicts and to be charitable to those in need.

In the document that announced the Jubilee Year of Mercy, Misericordiae Vultus, Pope Francis makes this connection between giving of ourselves and the importance of mercy. In fact he even uses the phrase, "gift of oneself." He writes, "The Church's first truth is the love of Christ. The Church makes herself a servant of this love and mediates it to all people: a love that forgives and expresses itself in the gift of oneself. Consequently, wherever the Church is present, the mercy of the Father must be evident. In our parishes, communities, associations and movements, in a word, wherever there are Christians, everyone should find an oasis of mercy (MV §12)."

This is such a timely message in our world today. Our world definitely needs God's love and mercy. And we can bring those gifts to our world and the people we encounter in the "gift of ourselves."
