PASTORAL COUNCIL CORNER

The October 17 meeting began with a prayer. The very well received presentation by Fr. Paul Turner on Tuesday, September 20 substituted for our September meeting. We will try to increase parish awareness of the mission and duties of the Pastoral Council by publishing names and email addresses of members in the Bulletin and on the parish website, communicating regularly with parish ministries and the school, and encouraging all to bring issues of serious interest to council for discussion and action recommendations.

The greatest part of the meeting was spent in discussing the current feasibility study looking at projects proposed for the church, parish and school. Interview and survey results received and tabulated to this point were presented at the Quarterly session last week by Advancement Director Barb DiTurno, and her information gave a good early view of developing consensus and support for a capital campaign to fund many of the projects. Parishioners who have not yet been consulted may complete the survey online, available soon on the website.

Fr. Eugenio Barbosa Martins, General Superior of the worldwide Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament will be visiting the United States for the first time in November. Besides conferring with all of the local members of the Congregation, Fr. Martins has asked to meet with Pastoral Council, so the November Council meeting will be moved from the end of the month to Monday, November 14.

Fr. Lane will address questions/comments from the Suggestion Box in upcoming bulletins. He reported that repair of the Eastern entrance to the church (damaged in a car collision) would take about six weeks.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time: Regularly I speak with folks about where they are with their faith: worried about the afterlife! I try to assure them, but I sometimes wonder if I am able to change their mind and ease the anxiety. This weekend's readings remind us of a very important part of our faith, so important we say it in the creed: "The resurrection of the body and life everlasting." We realize that God created us to always be with Him – God is the God of the living. We will always live with God, unless we choose to separate ourselves from God. This is what is helpful to remember: talking and thinking about God, praying, being part of worship – this is being with God – and

we are with our living God. We have nothing to fear!

Prayers for Vocations & SSS NEWS: Fr. Lito is back in the Philippines for a bit to be with his family, but especially his father, who is dying. With him away, we recognize more acutely the shortage of ordained men to serve. The area parishes (Saint Francis, Saint Clare and ourselves) have the priests regularly cover the hospital on Fr. Lito's day off – but when he is not there, we take a full day of coverage. Additionally, there are convents that we serve to provide the celebration of the Eucharist at the motherhouses of the Ursuline Sisters (Pepper Pike) and the Sisters of Notre Dame (Munson). Fr. Roger, Fr. Paul and Fr. Lito regularly assist in this ministry of service to these sisters and other parishes in the area. This Sunday, due to Fr. Lito's sudden departure, I'll be helping the Sisters of Notre Dame by celebrating their Mass. Fr. Lito hopes to be back December 7. In the meantime, let us also pray for more men to come forward to be Blessed Sacrament priests to help in this vital ministry. Also add a prayer or two for more men to be brothers and deacons to come and be part of the mission of the SSS.

Identifying the Capital Campaign Needs: We continue to reflect on the first phase of a capital campaign, the feasibility study and the results of many of you, your thoughts, hopes and desires for the future of the parish. It seems to me that it's time to test the top 5 concerns and areas and see if these resonate with people:

- Top concern and need: STEM (Science) Classroom addition
- Next: Revamping the computer center and library into a modern "learning commons"
- Parking Lot and driveway repaving, replacement and update
- Updating Fr. O'Brien Hall (the cafeteria and Taste of the Town center) to a fully modern kitchen (nothing has been changed since the 1980s)
- The replacement and upgrade of the church windows from single pain to double pain

Please continue to dialog with the Pastoral Council, Finance Council and Pastoral Staff on these items as we move closer to our next steps and make sure we have strengths of agreement around these areas of "new & improved."

SE Church Narthex Entrance: Thank you for your patience as we wait for this entrance/exit to be redone. Construction and reconstruction takes time and patience. The insurance company will be paying for this fix.

Special Thanks: Valuable community building and fundraising time regularly takes place at SPB. I want to give a special thanks and words of appreciation to Gina Pilla and the PTO for the great work on the Walk-a-thon, raising over \$26,000, to the Youth Group (and Evamarie Mickol) for Trunk-or-Treat, raising \$1,850 for the Easter Break mission trip to Arizona to do service work and lead a Life in the Eucharist Retreat, and to Taste of the Town, led by Kathy Pohlhammer and Chris Hart and company (a very busy, quiet team) that worked so hard to make it a success. In future bulletins we will have the results of this fundraiser, also benefiting our award- winning school.

Lastly, a special word of thanks to so many parishioners who work so hard to make sure we truly have the best school. Many of our parishioners do not have any children in the school – yet they want all our children to benefit from an excellent Catholic education. What a great model of service, faith and care! THANK YOU SO MUCH!

Special SSS Visitation: Our last bit of special news for the SSS world is that our head leader, or as we call him our “Superior General,” Father Eugênio Barbosa Martins, originally from Brazil, and Father Joseph Vu Quoc Binh, General Consultor, originally from Vietnam, will be here with us November 10 – 17. You will meet them next weekend at the 4:30 p.m. Saturday and 10:00 a.m. Sunday Masses. This is part of an official visit to all of our religious around the country November 1-26.



This is Father Eugênio's first trip to our country. He was born in Araguari, Minas Gerais, Brazil, on September 5, 1960. He professed first vows on January 25, 1984, and was ordained a priest on January 24, 1988. He served in various ministries in the Province of Santa Cruz (Brazil), including Provincial Superior from 2002 to 2010, and was chosen the 14th successor to Saint Peter Julian Eymard as Superior General on May 16, 2011. He is fluent in several languages and

brings a wealth of experience to his duties in leadership and animation of the Congregation.



Father Joseph has served as a General Consultor for three years and is convener of the International Commission on Mission. He was born in Vietnam on November 11, 1974, professed first vows on August 2, 2001, and was ordained to the priesthood on February 11, 2009. He attended our Provincial Chapter in November 2014, representing Father General and the General Council.

The *Rule of Life* of the Congregation states in number 73: *“The Superior General is the highest authority in the Institute after the General Chapter and is president of the General Council. He is elected by the General Chapter for a term of six years.”*

“The Superior General exercises his authority at the service of the Congregation’s unity and its mission in the world in conformity with the norms of the Rule of Life. In union with his council, he animates and coordinates the life and mission of the Institute.”

We welcome them for this special visit – and I know you will make them feel at home in “Tribe Country.”

Let us continue to pray for each other and “those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith.”
