The Blessed Sacrament Community, Pastoral Staff and Sisters of Notre Dame are so happy you are here to worship with us this wonderful day of our salvation. We rejoice in the story of our Savior's birth and marvel that our God shows us such love. This day reminds us how we have been touched by God and reminded of God's Real Presence in our world. This Good News brings us comfort and glad tidings (as we sing in many hymns). May the blessing of this holy liturgical season support your family in the year ahead.

They also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus mansionem benedicat*, “May Christ bless the house.” The “+” signs represent the cross and 2017 is the year.

The Church has a custom of blessing homes during the week of the Solemnity of the Epiphany. Family and friends gather to ask God's blessing on their homes and those who live there or visit the home. The chalk markings over the door are an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows.

The ARISE faith sharing groups have again prepared Epiphany House Blessing kits for St Clare and St Paschal parishioners, which will be blessed and distributed at all Masses on January 7th and 8th.

COMMUNITY AT PRAYER

We are in need of parishioners and friends to sign up for the following hours to provide a witness, in vigil, in the setting of exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. From the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament *Rule of Life* we read the importance of this mission of the SSS and SPB:

RL 31 Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: By drawing our attention to the signs of the Sacrament, exposition of the Holy Eucharist calls to mind the celebration of the Memorial of the Lord.

It invites us to recognize and adore the presence of Christ in the gift of his body given up for us and of his blood poured out for a New Covenant. Thus exposition facilitates our communion with Christ (Cf. EM 60, RR 82) who offers himself to us as the Bread of Life, nourishment shared for a community of brothers. We practice and encourage it, mindful of the pastoral needs of the local Church.

RL 32 Participation of the people: We associate the people with our prayer so that their lives may be enlightened and penetrated by the paschal mystery. We are attentive in promoting communal prayer; it manifests the unity of the Church, fruit of the Eucharist. According to pastoral possibilities, we encourage nocturnal prayer in a spirit of watching and waiting for the Lord.

Someone once said “marriages may be made in heaven, but they sure take a lot of work on earth.” Have you become so distracted by outside pressure that you neglect your spouse?
