COMMUNITY AT PRAYER

We are in need of parishioners and friends to sign up for the following hours to provide a witness, in vigil, in the setting of exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. From the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament *Rule of Life* we read the importance of this mission of the SSS and SPB:

RL 31 Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: By drawing our attention to the signs of the Sacrament, exposition of the Holy Eucharist calls to mind the celebration of the Memorial of the Lord. It invites us to recognize and adore the presence of Christ in the gift of his body given up for us and of his blood poured out for a New Covenant. Thus exposition facilitates our communion with Christ (Cf. EM 60, RR 82) who offers himself to us as the Bread of Life, nourishment shared for a community of brothers. We practice and encourage it, mindful of the pastoral needs of the local Church. **RL 32 Participation of the people:** We associate the people with our prayer so that their lives may be enlightened and penetrated by the paschal mystery. We are attentive in promoting communal prayer; it manifests the unity of the Church, fruit of the Eucharist. According to pastoral possibilities, we encourage nocturnal prayer in a spirit of watching and waiting for the Lord.

A number of parishioners have requested an opportunity to come together to reflect on Scripture, to learn more about our faith, and to share with one another. In response, the Spiritual Formation Committee is again sponsoring the ARISE: Together in Christ Program, where you can do all these things in a small group setting.

Our next program will be the week of February 27, 2017 and will run for six

weeks during Lent. Small groups will gather once a week for an hour and a half, on a day and time of their choosing. Each participant will receive a book which contains prayer, Scripture readings, reflections and faith-sharing questions. The atmosphere is informal and a trained leader will help to facilitate the prayer and sharing. The cost of the 6-week program is \$13, which covers the cost of the book. Registration will be held the weekends of February 4-5, 11-12 and 18-19.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Happy New Year! Happy World Day of Peace & Mary, the Mother of God:

Today is such a special day for us in the western world and Roman Catholic Church for we combine three events into one great holiday and solemnity of church life. We start off the year praying with the model of all discipleship and motherhood. Our very own mother's day! And what a great example of discipleship, spending time to ponder all the wonders around her.

Perhaps our life has been filled with a lot of wonder – a lot of business and celebration. Now we begin a new year and it's time to reflect and ponder like Mary. Many of our parishioners have a lot of extra time to ponder – and then there are people like me who need to carve out some extra time for quiet, reflection and peace. Wherever we are in life, we are blessed that we are in a wonderful “holy family” of SPB and that we continue to grow together in the beauty of God's love. May 2017 be a blessed year for you – and know that the Blessed Sacrament Community, Sisters of Notre Dame and the Pastoral Staff wish you the best, healthiest and happiest year. We are so glad to be together.

And, if you have a chance, be sure to look on the web for Pope Francis' special message of peace. It is a wonderful reflection on how we are to grow in the human family and be agents of peace together.

New Year's Resolutions? Come to Daily Mass! Recently when I was leading a parish mission, I was impressed with all the parishioners who attended Weekday Mass - 250. (This parish is the same demographics as ours – and has no school.) I remember growing up here at SPB when there were so many who attended the multiple Masses we celebrated each day. Many of these faithful followers have gone to their eternal reward. Now it is our turn to come forward and give thanks to God each day of our life and, when possible, to come to church to celebrate these sacred mysteries. Let us make room for Christ in our busy lives. The Mass is the best gift God has given us to remember each day his love and to pray for nourishment and strength in our lives. Why not come to celebrate as much as you can, during the New Year?

If not able to attend Mass, why not join in the other prayer of the church, the Liturgy of Hours – Morning Prayer at 8:00 a.m. and Evening Prayer at 4:45 p.m.?

Coming for Epiphany: Our Spiritual Formation Committee and ARISE Prayer Groups have encouraged us to have a special blessing of our homes for the New Year. Again this year, with the added extra of a holy water bottle, our ARISE Prayer Groups have worked hard to put a packet together. These will be blessed at the Epiphany Masses as a gift for you to take home to also bless your home with the chalk, writing above your doorway 2 0 + C + M + B + 17. The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross and 2017 is the year.

PASTORAL COUNCIL CORNER

What a great way to conclude the calendar and liturgical year with the message of Father Eugenio Barbosa Martins, Superior General of the worldwide Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament, to the Pastoral Council on November 14: "It is our mission, as a Congregation, including the laity, to rekindle our passion for the Eucharistic mission, and to bring this fire to the four corners of the world, and so transform the world through prayer, community and service." Father General (originally from the state of Minas Gerais, Brazil) spoke to us in Italian, translated by Father Joseph Vu Quoc Binh from Vietnam, a General Consultor for the Congregation. Father Martins asked to hear from each member, about themselves and their life in this Blessed Sacrament parish. A short reception and refreshments followed.

Afterwards, a brief business session ensued. The top five projects proposed for the parish by surveys of parishioners up to this point were discussed and each member polled for his/her opinion about the whole range of projects and the feasibility of a successful capital campaign to raise necessary funds.
