We are in need of parishioners and friends to sign up for the following hours to provide a witness, in vigil, in the setting of exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. From the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament *Rule of Life* we read the importance of this mission of the SSS and SPB:

RL 31 Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: By drawing our attention to the signs of the Sacrament, exposition of the Holy Eucharist calls to mind the celebration of the Memorial of the Lord. It invites us to recognize and adore the presence of Christ in the gift of his body given up for us and of his blood poured out for a New Covenant. Thus exposition facilitates our communion with Christ (Cf. EM 60, RR 82) who offers himself to us as the Bread of Life, nourishment shared for a community of brothers. We practice and encourage it, mindful of the pastoral needs of the local Church. **RL 32 Participation of the people:** We associate the people with our prayer so that their lives may be enlightened and penetrated by the paschal mystery. We are attentive in promoting communal prayer; it manifests the unity of the Church, fruit of the Eucharist. According to pastoral possibilities, we encourage nocturnal prayer in a spirit of watching and waiting for the Lord.

WE KNOW IT'S CHRISTMASTIME, BUT WHAT ARE YOU DOING for LENT?



A number of parishioners have requested an opportunity to come together to reflect on Scripture, to learn more about our faith, and to share with one another. In response, the Spiritual Formation Committee is again sponsoring the ARISE: Together in Christ Program, where you can do all these things in a small group setting.

Our next program will be the week of February 27, 2017 and will run for six weeks during Lent. Small groups will gather once a week for an hour and a half, on a day and time of their choosing. Each participant will receive a book which contains prayer, Scripture readings, reflections and faith-sharing questions. The atmosphere is informal and a trained leader will help to facilitate the prayer and sharing. The cost of the 6-week program is \$13, which covers the cost of the book.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Happy Epiphany – Happy “Little Christmas”; Many of our Christian friends, the Orthodox and eastern rites have celebrated this day as the penultimate day of the Christmas Season. The Manifestation of the LORD, or the Epiphany, has been celebrated and customarily the important day due to the special nature in Matthew’s Gospel of Gentiles finding the Christ Child. The message of Christ is for everyone – all the earth -and this is still a quite significant aspect of Christmas. We

are to continually evangelize – share the Good News – of Christ’s birth and what it did for humanity.

In the western church, we focus on other aspects of the Epiphany by breaking out the details of today’s Gospel. This year I want us to focus on seeing the stars or the signs in our life that point the way to Christ. Lately, perhaps because of the negative election cycle, people have been down, pessimistic and just plain unhelpful. Today’s feast reminds us that Christ’s light never dims, is always present and that we are on a journey to follow that light wherever it goes. More importantly, as baptized followers of Christ, (for tomorrow is the celebration of the feast day of the Baptism of the LORD and this year the shortest Christmas Season), we are to remember that we are optimists. “The glass is always half full,” and we have gifts to share – to Christ in one another. May we continue to be strong, not lose faith or heart, and bring that light of Christ that we have been given to a world in need of that hope and peace.

Hearing Assist System: Through a generous grant, we were able to purchase a hearing assist system for the church. Like a lending library, the devices are kept with the musicians and you may come to the piano before Mass to receive the device and then return it to the piano at the end of Mass. Special thanks to Sam Massina, class of 1966, for always making sure through his Showtime Sound Company, that we have the best in sound for our difficult space and the most updated equipment.

Bless Your Home: Our Spiritual Formation Committee and ARISE Prayer Groups have encouraged us to have a special blessing of our homes for the New Year. Again this year, with the added extra of a holy water bottle, our ARISE Prayer Groups have worked hard to put a packet together. Write above your doorway 2 0 + C + M + B + 17. The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus mansionem benedicat*, “May Christ bless the house.” The “+” signs represent the cross and 2017 is the year.
