4th Sunday in Ordinary

Time: Today we hear proclaimed the Beatitudes in Matthew Chapter 5. These familiar statements of blessedness help us to be assured of God's happiness with us in

whatever state and focus of our life. More importantly we remember that our reward is greater than this world – it is heaven! As Paul says in his writings, “we keep our eye on the prize” and rejoice that this world is not the end for us. Today's second reading from Corinthians helps us reflect on our calling to raise ourselves to heavenly standards. A NEW MASS SETTING

In 2011, all parishes and institutions within the Diocese of Cleveland were asked to learn the *Mass of St. Paul the Apostle* by Christopher Walker. The request met with great success.
