Our preliminary days of preparation last week prepare us for the transformation that God is calling us to experience this season.

While we remember Jesus’ life, we also recognize that we are recalling our own passion, faith walk and more. What will I do for Lent? What will I be for Lent? And not just Lent, for it’s about a life transformation, not just a season. What we do for Lent, we do for life!

## **REMINDERS FOR LENT**

### **Fast & Abstinence:**

1. All Catholics 14 years and older are to abstain from all meat on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent, unless a particular Friday is a solemnity.
2. All Catholics who are between the ages of 18 – 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (Canon #1252).
3. Fasting permits one full meal and two lesser meals, which combined are not greater than the full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted.
4. A spirit of fasting is recommended during all of Lent in anticipation of the great feast of Easter. In this way, Christians express their hunger for God, their responsibility to the poor and their recognition of the Kingdom of God as the answer to all human hungers.
5. Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors who are not bound by the law of fast and abstinence are educated in an authentic sense of penance (Canon #1252).
6. Airport workers, travelers and others while on board ships or airplanes are dispensed from the laws of fasting and abstinence for the duration of their journey (except Good Friday). However, it is desirable that those so dispensed should perform some pious work in compensation.

### **Easter Duty**

Every Catholic is to receive Holy Communion at least once between the First Sunday of Lent (name date) and Trinity Sunday (name the date) unless a just cause would warrant some other time of year (Canon #920).

- **ARISE FAITH SHARING GROUP:** Join in a group either here or with our clustermates, Saint Clare, for a group that meets in the morning, or afternoon or in the evening at either location.
- **BIBLE STUDY:** Men gather Tuesdays in the parish office at 7:00 p.m. There is a mixed gender group that meets on Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m.
- **WEEKDAY MASSES:** Come one day a week to one of our many weekday Masses in the church, the chapel or Saint Ann Shrine at 11:30 a.m.
- **SUNDAY MASS:** Come early to prepare the readings – give yourself more time with getting ready for Mass with your family – and get here in time to hear the great preludes and other musical pieces. Or for those who leave early from Mass – plan on staying for the entire liturgy.
- **MORNING OR EVENING PRAYER:** Join with the Blessed Sacrament Community that leads the prayers of the church, 8:00 a.m. or 4:45 p.m. weekdays. 20 minutes of prayers and intercessions.
- **PRAYER IN THE PRESENCE OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT:** When driving in the area, make a visit to the chapel to spend more time in prayer, or even better, make an appointment with God by signing up for an hour of praying with the Community at Prayer ministry.
- **OPERATION RICE BOWL:** Make sure to have a rice bowl on your table so that you may be in communion with those who need food. Follow the calendar that is provided to grow in our awareness of the needs of our brothers and sisters around the globe.
- **STATIONS OF THE CROSS:** Join in this special devotion either with the entire community, Friday night at 7:00 p.m.
- **PLAN ON ATTENDING THE PARISH MISSION AND BRING OTHERS WITH YOU:** March 11 – 14.
- **SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:** We have many opportunities for the sacrament to be celebrated individually or communally:
  - **Saturdays:** 3:30 p.m. until the last one is there in line
  - **Monday, March 13, 7:00 p.m.** during parish mission
  - **Wednesday, March 15, pick a time between 5:00 – 8:00 p.m.** The Diocesan Night of Confession.
