Third Sunday of Lent: Do we see ourselves at the well with Jesus this Sunday? The woman is not named in the Gospel story for a reason so that anyone of us could see ourselves as this person at the well. We are the broken, the outcast, the one searching for “living water” and searching for more hope and connection in our lives.

There is a thought that this woman was given a special name later on in the church’s life – called Saint Photini. (Her feast day ironically is usually March 20 – but because of this Sunday being March 19, the solemnity of Saint Joseph is transferred to tomorrow, Monday, March 20, a switcheroo in the liturgical calendar!) Photini means “enlightened one,” for that’s what she became in her conversation with Christ. What a wonderful reminder these two Sundays – this and last week, how we are called to listen, exchange in conversation and grow together in faith and the light of knowledge with God.

As Ed Hahnenberg has written in *Give Us This Day*, March 2017, page 201, “The readings today ask us to imagine water that bursts forth from rock, water poured out, water that flows – living water. But I am drawn to the deep and still moments by the well. In this pause between words, a woman recognized herself in the love of Christ. The text describes only her outward response. It is for us to image – what is going on inside [and inside of us].” Her response is to evangelize – to tell everyone about Christ. So is ours today, especially as we remember our baptismal call to “Go and serve the LORD.”

Church Lighting Issues: While during many seasons of the church year we use “mood lighting” to set the tone, there is a section above the SE Narthex toward the choir and chapel that has really been out do to a fuse problem. The fixture above the choir has caused this “short” and sent the rest of the lights out. This is a good reminder that our lighting system at the 30-foot beam level is in need of replacing. We are discerning if this may be part of the church window renovation or a separate budget item for the ongoing maintenance of the church. When we first looked into LED lighting a few years back, it was almost \$80,000 to replace all the lighting fixtures in church and bring them up to 21st century standards. Luckily, the competition in the market and the fact that everywhere people are converting to the latest LED technology has brought the costs down. So, if you win the lottery, you may help us with this expense, please, last bid at \$25,000.

Diocese Meeting This Week: We are grateful for all who give so generously to the church, whether it be through a legacy gift, a will or trust, or in the regular collections. You support our great parish! We ask for your continued support as we present our “first draft” of our capital

improvement projects to the diocese – sharing with the diocese how you voted for a new STEM classroom addition to the school, upgrade the library and computer lab in the school, upgrade the parking lot and drive ways, replace the single-pane windows in the church and modernize Father O'Brien Hall. As we all remember, the diocese and the bishop are the lead stewards of these properties and buildings. In good faith, we will be presenting our feasibility study and proposals for their input, discernment and approval. Members of our pastoral staff and chairs of our Pastoral & Finance Councils will be with me to represent you. Let us pray for a great meeting Thursday afternoon.

Continued Lenten blessings! Let's continue to pray for each other!

PASTORAL COUNCIL CORNER

The March Pastoral Council Meeting on Monday March 6th opened with a Lenten mission prayer.

Father Lane suggested a theme for the proposed **Capital Campaign** to fund renovation and construction: "Forward in Faith, Hope and Love." A meeting with Diocesan personnel who oversee major parish projects has already taken place: they provide advice and help with scheduling, project scope and budget. One suggestion was to replace the center section of the St. Paschal Lane entry by the SSS community buildings and small parking lot with concrete now, due to the advancing deterioration. Another meeting to tap Diocesan help will take place later this month. The Highland Heights building commission will not allow any more parking spaces to be added on the Wilson Mills frontage.

The consultants for the **Five-Year Pastoral Strategic Plan** reported their suggestions for the parish to create new Committees for Marketing and Advancement and new Commissions on Family Life and Social Justice to make very clear the responsibilities for plan implementation. These entities were referenced in the Plan, but do not exist at this time.

The updated **Parish Pictorial Directory** will schedule family photo sessions for May. Please plan to participate so we may improve on the 1 in 6 participation rate for the last directory!

The **Suggestion Box** yielded \$29 in cash and checks – a nice emolument for Council members (just kidding – the funds went for parish needs). Suggestions included: have a Soup Sunday meal every week in Lent (hope you attended the very nice March 12 meal provided by the Welcoming Committee for the start of the parish mission); use text/phone alerts for changes in Mass schedule, Daylight Savings Time, etc.; raise the volume on the celebrants' microphone at Mass (remember that hearing assist devices are available from the Music Ministry at each Mass).

COMMUNITY AT PRAYER NEWS

Many of our pray-ers have gone to God over the years, a few have moved to other places. However, we are now at a point where, after consultation with the Liturgy Commission and Dick Kramer, chair of the ministry, we are making a few decisions: we will no longer have exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Friday and Saturdays. Those who did have an hour on Friday are welcome to still come to pray – for Christ is always present. However, we will not have exposition, that is using a monstrance with the Blessed Sacrament, for there are so many times on Friday and Saturday when the monstrance and tabernacle are being left there and unlocked and this is not allowed by church law. Exposition is a formal liturgical rite of the church; we are not allowed to just expose for a moment here and there. With so few on Friday and Saturday, we are asking those members of the Community at Prayer to attend to hours during the week that need coverage. Dick will be providing a new list for us at the table next to the chapel. Thank you for understanding. We are discerning the future of this ministry and hope more people will continue to join in this powerful ministry of prayer. As usual, the church is open for prayer all the time, and one may always “make a visit.” This is highly encouraged and one may pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament without exposition.
