COMMUNITY @ PRAYER MEMBERS UPDATE

If there is no one to follow you in prayer, and there must be someone present at the "shift change," please do the following steps:

- o Repose the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle
- o Lock the tabernacle
- o Return the tabernacle key to the sacristy
- o Return the monstrance to the sacristy
- o Blow out the candles

If you find that there is no Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament – that's OK! Please stay and pray anyway, since the real presence of Christ is there in adoration with the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle. Remember for centuries, we did not use a monstrance, but dedicated pray-ers, like you, still came to pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Effective immediately, there is no Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Fridays and Saturdays – this is due to the safety and care of the Blessed Sacrament; it is church law to not keep the tabernacle open or exposition when there is no one present. If you were on Friday, please note that Dick will share with you other times that we need folks to pray on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Thank you for your dedication and prayer. FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Due to the production schedule of the bulletin, this column was written on March 12.

Fourth Sunday of Lent: At this point in Lent we have our lengthy annual readings that call us to deepen our reflection, deepen our love for great stories and most importantly, see ourselves in these settings. It is quite challenging for us to “live in the light,” to see as God sees and to have total sight. Each day we are faced with people who do not even want to be bothered to see, to have to

experiences or face the challenges that are put in front of their face. Yet at the same time, the healing that occurs in the Gospel story is so quick and wonderfully miraculous, I sometimes hope for such quickness in seeing, forgiving, shepherding and loving. It’s a little more of an adventure, I’m afraid.

In a few weeks we will be “washing in the pool of Siloam,” that is, renewing our baptismal vows at the Easter Vigil (9:00 p.m. on Saturday, April 15) or Easter Sunday (April 16: 6:30 a.m., 8:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m. or Noon). This is an opportunity for us to commit again to our Christian discipleship and apostolic ambitions, to live as God calls us to be “holy, blameless” and shepherding God’s people. Let us take this opportunity this weekend to “go to the eye doctor,” that is take some time in working on seeing better. We all have a blind spot to something in our lives; let’s reflect with God and a good friend on how we might better deal with it and growing in God’s vision.

There’s No Place Like Home: While it was a joy to swap parishes with Fr. Dragga and to lead a parish mission last week in Brunswick, it made me appreciate our parish even more! It reminded me on how welcoming we can be, mostly are, and need to continue to strive to serve all who come through our doors. Continue to not hesitate to greet your neighbor in the pew! It might be a visitor, it might be a regular of SPB just at another Mass – but most importantly – Christ is in the person and they would love to be seen and talked to by you!

Time to Prepare: We are blessed to have so many dedicated parishioners who participate in the life of the parish by serving on the four main councils of our parish. It is time for new members to serve on the Pastoral Council, Finance Council, Liturgical Commission and School Advisory Council. In today’s bulletin, you will find an application form for both the Pastoral & Finance Councils. But, we are also looking for dedicated folks to serve on the Liturgy Commission and school parents to serve on the School Advisory Council. We are praying with the Holy Spirit to have you discern and participate in sharing your gifts of visioning for the future of our parish. We are in the 3rd year of our Pastoral Plan and have accomplished a lot already. We are already starting to think ahead to the future and need your help in doing so.

Just a note, while the form in the bulletin was designed for Pastoral & Finance Council positions, please use it for the Liturgy Commission. The School Advisory Council has a form on the school website to fill out. For the Liturgy Commission, we assign in the worship, spiritual and praying life of our parish. We continuously evaluate, plan and implement liturgy – we would love for you to join our team.

Most of these councils meet once a month at a regular time, for instance School Advisory Council is the 4th Tuesday of the month. You see that we are regularly meeting – so join us for a meeting or two to discern if these places of ministry and service are of interest to you and will help us grow in the parish's life and implement our Pastoral Plan.

Continued Lenten blessings! Let's continue to pray for each other!

Application for the Pastoral Council or Finance Council Saint Paschal Baylor 2017

We read from the church's 1983 Code of Canon Law 536:

A pastoral council is to be established in each parish, over which the pastor presides in which the Christian faithful, together with those who share in pastoral care by virtue of their office [ministry position] in the parish [i.e. Parochial Vicar, Pastoral Associate(s)], assisting in fostering pastoral activity. A pastoral council possesses a consultative vote.

This council assists the pastor in fostering pastoral activity. The vision developed by the Second Vatican Council has the pastoral councils exist to do pastoral planning and do so in an advisory and consultative way. Our parish pastoral council has been extremely helpful in identifying needs and steps to implement goals and objectives; in the past few years we have worked in collaboration with different ministry groups, Leadership Day, the Ministry Fair and now, most importantly, the Strategic Plan, which is now in its 3rd years as our Pastoral Plan.

Also in Canon Law 537:

In each parish there is to be a finance council that is governed, in addition to universal law, by norms issued by the diocesan bishop and in which the Christian faithful, ... are to assist the pastor in the administration of the goods of the parish.

This too, is a collaborative structure necessary for administration of the parish and its pastoral activity. Our Finance Council reviews the parish financial activity, budget, Endowment Fund and all the other temporal concerns of our parish life. They monitor all of our accounts and assist in allocating funds for certain projects, especially in the area of maintenance and physical care of the campus. There are two distinctive roles for these council in developing parish life.
